# Aloha!

The county of Maui consists of three islands, the islands of Maui, Molokai and Lanai. The island of Maui is the largest of these three islands with the largest population and infrastructure, with the city of Wailuku being the county seat. The islands of Molokai and Lanai are much smaller in size and population, and therefore services and resources are more limited on these two islands.

## Kahului Airport

### Accessible Parking

The State of Hawaii recognizes valid person with a disability parking placards issued by other states and countries for parking in designated, accessible parking spaces. Parking placards must be displayed from the vehicle's rearview mirror or on the front dash when the vehicle is parked in a designated space.
