


What is the Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities Home and Community Based (HCBS) Waiver?

- Medicaid 1915(c) Waiver that allows Hawaii to provide long term care services and supports in homes and communities as an alternative to institutional care



CMS Final Rule

- Defines home and community integration in settings
- Requires person-centered planning, guidelines and implementation schedule for full compliance



My Choice My Way Transition Plan

- Hawaii's plan that describes steps and activities to achieve compliance
- Guides how settings will be validated and remediation that needs to be done



Waiver

- Waiver services need to be designed to support community integration
- Renewal gives us opportunities to develop new services and retool others

Why Did CMS Make These New Rules?

- “To ensure that individuals... have full access to benefits of community living and the opportunity to receive services in the most integrated setting appropriate.”
- “To enhance the quality of HCBS and provide protections to participants.”



HCBS Setting Requirements



- The rules say people will be....
 - integrated where they live and go
 - supported to access the greater community
 - have opportunities to get a job and work in regular businesses
 - able to engage in community life
 - maintain control over their personal resources

HCBS Setting Requirements

- People have rights such as privacy, dignity, respect, and freedom from coercion and restraint.
- Optimizes individual initiative, autonomy, and independence in making life choices (**self-determination!**)
- Makes sure of individual choice about services and supports, and who provides them



G-1 Response to Critical Events or Incidents

Reporting and Management Process

G-2 Safeguards Concerning Restraints and Restrictive Interventions

- Positive Behavioral Support approach
- Restrictive measures are used only for the protection of Waiver participants from imminent harm to self or others
- Indicates who should have a Behavior Support Plan
- Defines seclusion, restraints, restrictive procedures, and aversive procedures/which are prohibited
- Prohibits the use of seclusion
- Outlines reporting, review and oversight
