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## Objectives



-  State findings from Hawaii's antibiotic stewardship program Assessment.

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## Study Objective



-  Our study aimed to evaluate the status of ASPs in Hawaii acute care and critical access hospitals.




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## Methods

- ☞ Adapted a web-based survey from the California Department of Public Health's ASP needs assessment conducted in 2010
- ☞ The survey was distributed to Infection preventionists (IPs) at all 25 facilities in the state. These included acute care hospitals (ACHs), critical access hospitals (CAHs) and inpatient rehabilitation facilities in Hawaii.
- ☞ We asked facilities to complete the survey as a multi-disciplinary team; each facility submitted a single survey.
- ☞ The survey included self-identification of ASP status by the facility.

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

Respondents of ASP Survey Representing 21 Healthcare Facilities – Hawaii, 2013




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

Self-identified ASP Status in Acute Care, Critical Access, and Rehabilitation Facilities in Hawaii (n=21)




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

Self-identified Barriers to ASP implementation (n=12)




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
