
Accomplishments



- **Renewable Energy – The Navy continues to pursue alternate energy initiatives**
 - Procurement action is ongoing for DoD's first Joint Service \$500 M Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Power Purchase Multi-Award Contract (MAC)
 - Implemented the Navy's first-ever Resident Energy Conservation Program (RECP) – the initial pilot in compliance with DoD policy to hold Public-Private Venture (PPV) base housing residents accountable for their energy consumption
- **Recycling – The Navy continues to operate a very successful recycling program**
 - JBPHH has a very successful recycling program that also now covers Hiackam AFB, and annually recycles close to 3,000 tons of materials, with annual revenues in excess of \$1.5M
- **Biofuel Initiatives**
 - Increased the use of bio-fuel vehicles with more than 1,000 E85 (15% ethanol) capable vehicles, and 400 diesel vehicles in the vehicle inventory



Challenges



- **Decreasing manpower**
 - Since Jan 2013, have lost approximately 15% of environmental staff
 - Hiring freeze has prevented any replacements
 - Missions and workloads have not declined
- **Budget Uncertainty**
 - Environmental compliance budgets have also declined and are projected to continue declining in the years to come
- **Continuing High levels of Regulator Scrutiny**
 - Regulator scrutiny has not decreased and continues to increase
- **Increased stress levels on staff and resources if compliance and environmental stewardship levels are to be maintained**
