Subarea Health Planning Councils (SACs) Activities

Kauai The Kauai County Subarea Health Planning Council is scheduled to meet on April 14, 2014. Mr. Bill Arakaki, Kauai Complex Superintendent, Hawaii Department of Education, will provide an overview of the activities of the Kauai Community Health Improvement Initiative's *Workgroup on Education and Lifelong Learning*.

Honolulu The Honolulu Subarea Health Planning Council met on March 6, 2014. Members continued their discussion on the early detection and diagnosis of the Alzheimer's disease public awareness project. The next meeting is April 3, 2014.

West Oahu and Windward Oahu

The West Oahu Subarea Health Planning Council met on March 6, 2014. Members heard from Noella Kong, Children and Youth Specialist, Hawaii Department of Health, Maternal and Child Health Branch who provided a briefing on "Bullying: A Public Health Issue". She informed members that the Department of Health Maternal and Child Health Branch conducts a needs assessment every five years. In its recent assessment, bullying was identified as a priority item. Ms. Kong shared results of the 2011 Hawaii Youth Risk Behaviors Hawaii School Health Survey.
