The ATR Ohana serves individuals with substance use disorders age 12 and older who have no other means to pay for needed services.

Our clients include those who may be in drug court, previously incarcerated, youth excluded from the school system, Deployed Veterans, Military, National Guard and Reserves, those experiencing health disparity, such as dual diagnosis, HIV/AIDS patients and methamphetamine clients with dental disease.

ATR Ohana providers serve native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, veterans, National Guard members and their dependents, child protective services clients, and those who value faith and cultural content in their recovery.

## WHAT IS the ATR Ohana?

- Hawaii's ATR Ohana is a public-private partnership including faith, cultural, and secular providers.
- The ATR Ohana helps those with substance use disorders receive assessment, treatment and recovery support services in their local community.
- Funding for the ATR Ohana is provided by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (SAMHSA/CSAT), and is managed through the Department of Health, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division.
- In Hawaii, over \$11.4 million has been awarded for four (4) years to assist over 8,000 individuals age 12 and older with substance use disorders engage in treatment and recovery support services of their choice.
- The ATR Ohana empowers clients to choose providers whose faith- or cultural-based approach, or whose secular approach, meets their needs for treatment and recovery.
- ATR Ohana's Voucher based funding is a fee-for-service that follows the client.
- Clients select from a list of authorized ATR Ohana services and providers.
- The ATR Ohana is a payer of last resort. ATR Ohana funds are limited. They are not intended to be a permanent subsidy or to meet all of the client's needs. Authorized service categories may change across the course of the grant to maximize available services and to meet emerging client needs.



The Vision of the Hawaii ATR Ohana is to strengthen, and heal shattered lives and families. The ATR Ohana envisions a system where individuals with substance use disorders are treated with dignity and respect, and that choice among treatment and recovery support service providers is maximized and expedited wherever possible. The ATR Ohana promotes self-care at the most fundamental levels, including empowering clients to select their service providers and to be actively involved in decisions affecting their life, care, and treatment.
