

Introduction to Level of Service Inventory-Revised (LSI-R)

SPONSORED BY THE HAWAII ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE DIVISION

Content: The Level of Service Inventory-Revised (LSI-R) is a quantitative survey of offender attributes and their situations relevant to the level of supervision and treatment decisions. Deigned for ages 16 and older, the LSI-R helps predict prole outcome, success in correctional halfway houses, institutional misconducts, and recidivism. The factors are utilized to make decisions about the offender's risk and treatment. This workshop will provide background information, information on how the LSI-R is scored, how to read the LSI-R/ASUS assessment summary, how the LSI-R is used by probation offices, and how the LSI-R information can be used in treatment planning and treatment reports.

Instructor: ICIS is an acronym for **Interagency Council on Intermediate Sanctions**. This is a statewide initiative under the SOH Judiciary which engages the Directors from five departmental stakeholders. They include the Department of Public Safety, Paroling Authority, Department of Health, The Office of the State Attorney General, and The Judiciary via an MOA. There are additional ancillary stakeholders and their respective designees from HPD, The Office of the Prosecuting Attorney, The Office of the Public Defender and private agencies. The vision and goal of ICIS is simply the reduction of recidivism through the endorsement and application of evidence based practices/principles/strategies for all criminal justice agencies at various entry points statewide. ICIS has been an initiative since 2002 and is based on the authority of the Hawaii State Supreme Court and Order signed by then Chief Justice Ronald Moon.

Target audience: Certified Substance Abuse Counselors (CSAC), CSAC applicants, those with other ADAD professional credentials, and anyone involved in the human service profession.

DIRECTIONS TO DOH STATE LABORATORY FACILITY

Coming from Honolulu on H1 West-bound [you're heading Ewa (west)]:

Take Exit #10, stay in the middle lane, turn right and merge into Moanalua Road in the westbound direction.

Coming from Leeward/Central Oahu on H1 East-bound [you're heading in the Diamond Head (east) direction]:

Take Exit #10, stay in your left lane. At the signal light, turn left onto Moanalua Road heading in the Ewa (westbound) direction.

1. After passing the first traffic signal at Hoomalu Street, get into the right lane and continue along Moanalua Road (passing Hoolaulea Street) to Waimano Home Road; turn right.
2. Stay in the right lane and travel all the way up Waimano Home Road, passing the Pearl City Cultural Center, until you reach the security guard station situated at the entrance to the Waimano Training School and Hospital grounds.
3. Continue up this narrow road (with several bends) for about three-quarters of a mile.
4. When you see a green "State Laboratories Facility" sign on a chain-link fence, turn right in front of the sign.
5. Proceed to the parking area and park in marked stalls. [Parking is available at the building-level plus on the three tiers above.]
