Current scientific evidence indicates that quarantine alone <u>reduces</u>:



New infections 44-96%



Deaths **31-76%** 



Viral reproduction **37-88%** 

<u>9%</u> of Hawaiʻi's population live in a <u>shared</u> <u>room</u>, indicating need for external isolation

#### **Outcomes**

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Connected to shelters (homeless)	7%
Linked to medical/behavioral health treatment or residential facility	3%
Connected and/or returned to previous housing (non-homeless)	90%
Received on-site crisis counseling and/or psychological evaluation	726

All 1726+ placed individuals received a wellness check 3x a day during the course of their stay and received 3 meals a day










## **NEW ADMITS AS A PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES ON O'AHU**
