<b>Tobacco Prevention and Control 2030 Plan</b>	<p>Hansen-Smith shared the context and framework of the final version of the Tobacco Prevention and Control Plan (TPCP) 2030.</p> <p>There are 12 TPCP Objectives which are meant to be dynamic and will be assessed and updated throughout the plan's timeline.</p> <p>A TPCP 2030 Tracker will be developed and housed on the Hawaii Health Data Warehouse.</p> <p>The TPCP can be accessed, downloaded and interacted with at: <a href="http://www.HHSP.hawaii.gov">www.HHSP.hawaii.gov</a></p>		<p>Questions taken and time for discussion provided</p> <p>Lee suggested that youth prevention activities be broad based and include venues, places and organizations where youth spend time in addition to school setting.</p> <p>Gloria asked if some information could be provided regarding smoking trends within LGBT population subgroups that could shed some light on whether this group should be aggregated or if disaggregation of this group should be considered</p> <p>Hansen-Smith responded that the DOH Tobacco Program intends to work with the community stakeholders on implementation to find out what they think would be the best way to reach and meet the needs of subgroups and to take the lead.</p> <p>Irvin shared the following links via chat regarding data on priority populations identified in the Tobacco Prevention Plan Tracker, and two</p>

<p><b>Legislative Update and Implications</b></p>	<p>Johnson shared a summary of the Electronic Smoking Device Legislation introduced and outcomes for 2021 session.</p> <p>Irvin provided an update on the status of HB1296 and the implications to the role of the advisory board should this bill become law.</p>		<p>Chun-Lum asked if there was any sense of how many people have written the Governor to veto HB1296?</p> <p>Irvin responded that is not something we know.</p> <p>Tam shared that people have not been mute. People have been making displeasure known.</p> <p>Irvin thanked the Advisory Board for their commitment to service. The Advisory Board has been in place for 20 years.</p>

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<b>Request for Public Comment</b>	Chair Wang made request for Public Comment.		<p>Lipsher asked how do we keep abreast of what is happening with the Tobacco Prevention &amp; Control Plan?</p> <p>Irvin replied that BRFSS and YRBS data will be updated on Healthy Hawaii Data Warehouse (HHDW) and Hawaii Health Matters websites for long term outcomes. Updates can be made to Healthy Hawaii Strategic Plan according to stakeholder input and policy impacts within the 10-year timeframe.</p> <p>Weisman pointed out that this is a community plan and not just a Department of Health Plan. Hundreds have participated in developing it and hundreds more will be involved in implementation. He urged the Board to get involved and bring others to be involved.</p> <p>Chair agreed and acknowledged that the Board has a responsibility to ensure the priority populations are embedded in the plan and to be an active participant in it.</p>
