Legislative Updates

 ✓ Bills HB1778 HD2, HB2341, HB 2441, HB 2504 HD2 SD1, SB1447 SD1 HD1, 46 and 102.

Significant bills that did not pass in the 2024 session

HB1778 HD1 - Restoring local control

Amends existing law regarding preemption of local ordinances and regulations regulating the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices as a matter of statewide concern to clarify that the State's preemption power extends solely to the taxation of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices and allows counties to adopt ordinances and regulations that regulate smoking or the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices.

HB2341 - Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund

Establishes a stamp fee floor inventory tax on the stock inventory of stamps held by licensees before any increase in the stamp fee under the cigarette and tobacco tax laws is assessed and levied. Amends the ceiling for the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund. Amends the cigarette tax stamp fee and the percentage of the cigarette tax stamp fee deposited to the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund. Amends the amount to be deposited to the credit of the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund from tobacco settlement moneys.

Significant bills that did not pass in the 2024 session

HB2441 - Flavor ban / Admin Bill

Bans the sale of all flavored tobacco products and mislabeled e-liquid products. Establishes positions and appropriates funds to enforce the ban. Repeals section 328J-11.5, HRS.

HB2504 HD2 SD1 - Cig Tax -> Hawai'i Cancer Research Special Fund

Beginning 7/1/2024, expands the cigarette tax levied upon a wholesaler or dealer under section 245-3, HRS, to electronic smoking devices and e-liquids. Requires 1.0 cent per cigarette, electronic smoking device, and e-liquid, but not more than \$500,000 per fiscal year, to be deposited into the credit of the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund. Clarifies that tax revenues deposited into the Hawai'i Cancer Research Special Fund shall not be used for early clinical trials.

SB1447 SD1 HD1- Restoring local control (2023)

Repeals existing law that preempted local ordinances or regulations that regulate the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices and nullified and voided any conflicting local laws and regulations. Allows counties to adopt ordinances that regulate the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices that do not conflict with and are more stringent than the state law that govern smoking.





HB982 HD1 SD2 CD1- Funding Tobacco Enforcement Unit (2023)

Amends the amount of funds within the tobacco enforcement special fund that may be carried over at the end of each fiscal year. Amends the amount of funds to be deposited to the credit of the tobacco enforcement special fund from the Hawai'i tobacco settlement special fund. (CD1)



Significant bills that passed between 2023-2024

Bills 46 and 102

Prohibit the sale of flavored tobacco products including menthol within the Counties of Honolulu and Hawaii.



Promotional Reach increased from 0.8% in FY22 to 1.6% in FY23 surpassing the CY22 goal of 1.4%




Promotional reach in FY18 and beyond includes partial web enrollment data, which was not available for earlier years. If we exclude that data to match the calculation from FY12-17, promotional reach decreases only very slightly (less than 0.1%). FY18 and 19 promotional reach are estimates as some missing data had to be imputed.






Treatment Reach more than doubled from 0.4% in FY22 to 1.0% in FY23











The number of unique participants more than doubled in FY23 with 1,954, compared to 943 in FY22.




Participation increased when promotional campaigns were running






FY23 marked the first-time web enrollments surpassed phone enrollments





Registration reach in every County increased from FY22 to FY23






In FY23 registration reached increased in every age category except 55+ and the largest increase were participants aged 34-54 years






- New e-referral partnership with Queen's Health Systems starting in January 2024




HTQL SUMMARY AND NEXT STEPS


- FY23 showed increases in enrollment and reach across almost every category
- FY23 highlighted the role that media plays in engaging the community with the Hawaii Tobacco Quitline
- Improvements needed in reaching those aged 18-34 years and collaborating with healthcare facilities to e-refer to the HTQL
- New effort to target those who use ESDs as 2022 BRFSS data show that ESD use is almost even with cigarette use in adults; certain populations (aged 18-34) show ESD use higher than overall ESD use rate
