	As part of the recommendation from ELWG, DOH submitted a request for another position in Early Intervention Section (EIS) to support children who are deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf-blind. EIS received and responded to questions regarding this position.	
Implementation Updates	Facilitator asked permission to draft documents to share with the ELWG to help expedite the processes since it is easier for members to respond to material rather than having to create it. CSC has been contracted to work on a pilot of a family-centered resource center and may need to develop a form to keep a list of permissions to share information with families. For example, before collecting family contact information, it should be decided about who is holding onto this information, for what purposes, and how these documents will be secured.	Keiko to draft documents for ELWG to review. CSC will be asked to attend an ELWG meeting to provide updates and share information. Group will need to discuss development of a form to keep information to contact with families.
Resources for Parents	Facilitator will start to develop one page handout for families as described in the legislative report. Before sharing, Keiko to find out how this information is collected (is it self-report) and what is actually meant by their ability to work with these children (do they have special programs or specialized staff?).
