Data on the wellbeing of young children in Hawaii indicate the need to improve 30.6%

Families could NOT always afford to eat good nutritious meals (age 0-5 years)

11.1%

Children have developmental, emotional, or behavioral problem (age 3-5 8.1%

children lived with someone who had a problem with alcohol or drugs (age 0-17 years)

6.4%

Children lived with someone who was mentally ill, suicidal, or severely depressed (age 0-17 years)

6.0%

Children saw or heard parents or adults slap, hit, kick, punch one another in the home (age 0-17 years)

Families can benefit from screening to identify concerns

- Children can be linked to services to help a child's developmental progress
- Families can be linked to resources and supports



Survey of Well-Being of Young Children (SWYC) is a screen to help identify concerns

- SWYC screening is for children under age 5 years (age 2 to 60 months)
- Families can complete the SWYC form in 5-10 minutes
- SWYC screens for:
 - Development
 - o Autism
 - Social-Emotional Development
 - Maternal Depression
 - Social Determinants of Health




SWYC merges various age-related tools for development, behavior, and family factors



SWYC is easily administered and scored by health, education, and child care professionals

- SWYC tool is FREE!
- Forms are specific for a child's age
- Each form is 2 pages
- Scoring can be done in less than 3 minutes
