

 Maximize your basin's function

Basins are meant to...

- Retain/Detain storm water
- Allow dirt to settle
- Contain storm water if
 possible
- Be a part of your storm water management system – not be the only physical BMP!

 Appendix C requirements

How the requirements allow it

- Size basin based on your project area or minimum 2-year, 24hour storm
- Utilize an outlet structure that skims from the top
- Stabilize your basin
- Use velocity dissipation for your basin's discharges
- Must be situated outside of State waters
- Remove accumulation to maintain capacity

Don't put your basin in line with a State water

Don't allow offsite water into your basin







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
