- I. Chairperson Violet Horvath called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.
- II. Committee members and staff introduced themselves.
- III. Statement from Public and Written Testimonies Submitted

Elizabeth Delovio reported that there was no written testimony submitted.

IV. <u>Bills and Resolutions</u>

A. Non-Discrimination

No bills related to this section were discussed.

B. Communication Access

SB312 HD1 – Relating to Audible Vehicle Reverse Warning Systems.

Requires the use of current audible reverse warning systems (back-up beepers) on state and county-owned vehicles purchased on or after 1/1/2028, with more effective broadband reversing alarms by 1/1/2028.

The Committee discussed the benefit of dual frequency alarms as effective communication, for safety purposes.

MOTION: SUPPORT (M/S/P Akamine/Kozai)

<u>SB1494 SD2</u> – <u>Relating to Hearing Aids.</u> Requires health insurance policies and contracts issued on or after 1/1/2026 to provide optional coverage for the cost of hearing aids at a minimum \$1,500 per hearing aid for each hearing-impaired ear every thirty-six months.

Elizabeth Delovio reported that this measure was deferred; SCR151 was introduced which is similar.

MOTION: SUPPORT (M/S/P Akamine/Kozai)

SCR151 – Requesting the Auditor to Assess the Social and Financial Effects of Mandating Health Insurance Coverage for Hearing Aids.

Peter Fritz informed the Committee that, under HRS §23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) a concurrent resolution requesting a social and financial impact study is required for bills like SB1494 to move forward. He clarified that SCR151 appears to fulfill this requirement, making it a necessary prerequisite for any similar legislation to proceed in the future.

SCR239/SR215 - Requesting the Department of Accounting and General Services, Department of Land and Natural Resources, and the City and County of Honolulu Department of Parks and Recreation to Provide Universal Changing Accommodations in all State Facilities, State Parks, and City and County Parks.

SB828 SD1 HD1 – Relating to Workers' Compensation Medical Benefits. HCR31- Requesting the University of Hawaii to Explore the Feasibility of Establishing an Alzheimer's Disease Research Center and Identify the Requirements for Receiving Federal Funding from the National Institute on Aging for Alzheimer's Disease Research.

Chairperson Violet Horvath noted the importance of the measure and stated that while federal funding can be uncertain, support for Alzheimer's research is likely to remain strong.

HCR36/SCR28 – Requesting the Auditor to Assess the Social and Financial Effects of Proposed Mandatory Health Insurance Coverage for Colorectal Cancer Screenings.

MOTION: SUPPORT (M/S/P Horvath/Akamine)

HCR39 – Requesting the Health Data Advisory Council to Confirm the Number of Uninsured Children Statewide and per County in 2025 and the Department of Human Services Med-Quest Division to Estimate Costs and Collaborate with the State Health Planning and Development Agency on Policy Changes Needed to Achieve the Goal of Universal Health Insurance Coverage for Children.

MOTION: SUPPORT (M/S/P Horvath/Kozai)

<u>SCR43/SCR45</u> – <u>Strongly Supporting and Recommending the Implementation of the Revised 2025 Hawaii Patient Bill of Rights.</u>

Elizabeth Delovio provided background on the resolution, explaining that it seeks to modernize patient protections, including safeguards against discriminatory Al-based coverage denials by requiring human review. The Committee commented that requiring review by at least two or three board-certified specialists would strengthen these protections.
