Information for Applicants

How do I apply for dental services provided at state dental clinics?

- Obtain a Dental Health Services Eligibility Application from one of four state dental clinics.

- Submit both white and yellow pages of the completed application to your clinic of choice or the Hospital and Community Dental Services Branch office.
- Call the clinic *ten working days after you submit the application* to find out if you are eligible for services. If you are eligible, staff will schedule an appointment.
- The period of eligibility for treatment is twelve months from the date services are authorized.

Who is eligible for dental services? Applications are reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Our target population is aged (65 or older) or certified blind or disabled individuals who are eligible for Medicaid's QUEST Integration program.

What dental services are available? For individuals eligible for services, emergency care and basic dental procedures such as examinations, x-rays, cleanings, fillings, single crowns, and extractions are available. Implants, bridges and full and partial dentures are not available.

How much does it cost for dental treatment? There are no fees for dental treatment except for lab fees associated with treatment. Patients are responsible to pay for all lab fees (denture repairs & crowns). Dentists are Medicaid Fee-For-Service providers. Dentists will submit claims for all dental procedures covered by Medicaid for reimbursements.

What forms must I complete before my treatment begins?

- General Consent to Treatment signed by the patient or legal guardian.
- Health History Form.
- Other information requested includes
 - Names, addresses, and phone numbers of patient's physicians.
 - Medical conditions and names and dosages of medications being taken.
 - Name and phone number of an emergency contact person.
