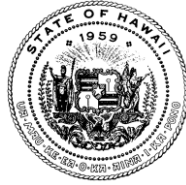

Dear DDD Certified Caregiver,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of one of the changes in the Adult Day Health (ADH) due to the amendments in the Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) Waiver. ADHs will no longer be required to provide lunch, although some ADHs may continue to provide lunch for a reasonable cost. As part of the adult foster care you provide, you will now be responsible for providing lunch for your foster adults or ensure that they are provided with the means to purchase lunch while attending ADH.

This change in the ADH will allow participants to have more options with their time during the day and not have to return to the ADH to have lunch. This change will become effective July 1, 2017 for everyone attending ADH.

You may want to check with your foster adult's ADH provider to find out if lunch will be offered. If you have any questions, please contact your adult foster home certifier:
