The certified caregivers shall obtain a signed physician's order for the identified medication by 12/07/19.</p> <p>Effective immediately, the certified caregivers shall read the medication label and the physician's orders and compare both of them with the Medication Administration Record (MAR) before given a medication (the physician's order, the MAR and the medication label must match). If there are any discrepancies or questions, the certified caregivers shall check with the pharmacist or prescriber to resolve the problem. The certified caregivers shall never be afraid to ask question. The certified caregivers shall obtain a signed physician's order or note clarifying the correct dosage for the identified medication by 12/07/19. If a physician's order that is consistent with what was given is not obtained, this will be considered a medication error and an Adverse Event Report (AER) shall be completed and submitted to the foster adult's case manager and the Certification Unit.</p> <p>Effective immediately, the certified caregivers shall have signed physician's orders for every medication or treatment.
