Dear Certified Caregiver,

The Developmental Disabilities Division (DDD) is partnering with Pharmacare Hawaii to administer drive-thru flu vaccines to participants, caregivers, and household members of DDD Adult Foster Homes. The drive-thru will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., Saturday, December 5, 2020 at 2201 Waimano Home Road. Only registered individuals with an appointment will receive the flu shot.

Why is it important to get a flu vaccine EVERY year?

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, a strong defense against the flu is to get vaccinated. Flu viruses are constantly changing so flu vaccines may be updated from one season to the next to protect against the viruses that will be common during the upcoming flu season.

Benefits of flu vaccination

- Can keep you from getting sick with flu
- Can reduce the risk of flu-associated hospitalization for children, working age adults, and older adults
- Is an important preventive tool for people with chronic health conditions
- Can be lifesaving in children

How to Register

1. Registration for the drive-thru flu clinic
 - All individuals will need to complete the online registration form in the attached DDD Flu Clinic Drive Thru Flyer. Online registration will close at 5:00 pm on November 20, 2020.
 - Participants who are filling out the form will need to select "Self."
 - If the participant has a legal guardian, the guardian will need to register the participant. Pharmacare will coordinate the appointment time with caregiver after the guardian submits the registration form. To send the registration form to the legal guardian, please refer to the Department of Health DDD Caregiver Instructions in the attachment.
 - Caregivers and household members are also welcome to sign-up for a flu shot. Select "Self" or "Parent" (for minors under the age of 18) when filling out the form.

2. Registration for participants who are homebound
 - Pharmacare will come to the participant's home to administer the flu shot if the participant is unable to physically leave the foster home.
 - Participants who are filling out the form will need to select "Self." Online registration will close at 5:00 pm on November 20, 2020.
 - If the participant has a legal guardian, the guardian will need to register the participant.
 - Pharmacare will coordinate the appointment date and time with the caregiver once the registration form is submitted by the participant or guardian.
 - Caregivers and household members of a participant who is homebound are also welcome to sign-up for a flu shot. Select "Self" or "Parent" (for minors under the age of 18) when filling out the form.

If you are unable to register online, please contact your certifier for assistance by November 11, 2020.
