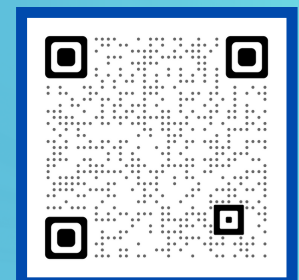
PRESENTER
