The freezer temperature for vaccine storage must be between -58°F and +5°F (-50°C and -15°C). This helps ensure optimal conditions for maintaining the potency of vaccines that require storage in the freezer.

Answer: (c) Between -58°F and +5°F (-50°C and -15°C)
