Test your vaccine knowledge.

Question: An 18-month old healthy child with no record of pneumococcal conjugate vaccination (PCV) should receive which of the following?

- a) 3 doses, 4 weeks apart, followed by a booster 8 weeks after the 3rd dose
- b) 2 doses, 4 weeks apart
- c) 1 dose only
- d) No doses are needed for a child 18 months of age and older
- e) None of the above are correct

Answer: e) None of the above are correct

All children less than age 60 months without contraindications should receive PCV13 vaccine. A previously unvaccinated healthy 18-month old, who receives their first dose on or after age 1 year needs two doses, at least 8 weeks apart.
