






- It supports state, territorial, county, and local health departments to acquire more comprehensive and timely data on overdose morbidity and mortality.



Figure 1. ED Visits vs All Drug, Opioid, and Stimulant-involved ED Visits in Hawaii, CYs 2021-22



In **CY 2021,** there were a total of <u>880 ED visits</u> related to drug overdose – *unintent/undeter*


Peaked at 92 ED visits in August 2021

In CY 2022, there were a total of <u>906 ED visits</u> related to drug overdose – *unintent/undeter*

- Peaked at 97 ED visits in October 2022
- 36.8% increase in All drug-related ED visits since 2021 (including CY 2022)
- All drug-related ED visits increased by a factor of 28 since 2018 (including CY 2022)

Suspected opioid overdose

- 2022 236 ED visits
- 2021 185 ED visits
- 2020 118 ED visits



Suspected heroin overdose*

- suppressed data; counts < 11

Suspected stimulant overdose

- 2022 67 ED visits
- 2021 95 ED visits
- 2020 64 ED visits

Figure 2. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Heroin, and Stimulant-involved ED visits by Sex, CY 2021 (n = 880)





Figure 3. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Heroin, and Stimulant-involved ED visits by Sex, CY 2022 (n = 906)

Figure 4. Percentage of <u>All Drug-involved</u> ED Visits by Age Group, CY 2021






Figure 5. Percentage of <u>All Drug-involved</u> ED visits by Age Group, CY 2022





Figure 5b. Percentage of Opioid-involved ED visits (%) by Age Group, CYs 2018-2022










Figure 9. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Stimulant, and Heroin-involved ED Visits by County, CY 2022 (n = 906)

Figure 10. Monthly Rates for All Drug-related ED Visits in Hawaii, CY 2021 & 2022 (per 10k ED visits)



Monthly rates for All Drug-related ED visits <u>decreased</u> overall (-18.9%) for the period of Jan '21 – Dec '22.

- Peaked at 29.58 (per 10k ED visits) in Dec '21
- Troughed at 16.87 (per 10k ED visits) in Aug '22.



Figure 11. Hospitalizations vs All Drug, Opioid, and Stimulant-involved Hospitalizations, CY 2021 & 2022



In CY 2021, there were <u>518 hospitalizations</u> related to drug overdose – *unintent/undeter*

Peaked at 50 hospitalizations in April 2021

For CY 2022, there were 401 hospitalizations related to drug overdose – unintent/undeter

- Peaked at 40 hospitalizations in both April and August 2022
- 71% decrease in All drug-related hospitalizations since 2021 (including CY 2022)
- 160% increase in All drug-related hospitalizations since 2018 including CY 2022)

Suspected opioid overdose

- 2022 99 hospitalizations
- 2021 59 hospitalizations
- 2020- 104 hospitalizations

- 2022 133 hospitalizations
- 2021 206 hospitalizations
- 2020- 235 hospitalizations

Figure 12. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Heroin, and Stimulant-involved Hospitalizations by Sex, CY 2021 (n = 518)





Figure 13. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Heroin, and Stimulant-involved Hospitalizations by Sex, CY 2022 (n = 401)

Figure 14. Percentage of <u>All Drug-related</u> Hospitalizations (%) by Age Group, CY 2021






Figure 15. Percentage of <u>All Drug-related</u> Hospitalizations (%) by Age Group, CY 2022


Figure 16. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Stimulant, and Heroin-involved Hospitalizations by Race/Ethnicity, CY 2022


Figure 17. Number of All Drug, Opioid, Stimulant, and Heroin-involved Hospitalizations by County, CY 2022 (n = 401)

Monthly rates for All Drug-related hospitalizations <u>decreased</u> overall (-94%) for the period of Jan '21 – Dec '22.

- Peaked at 57.62 (per 10k hospitalizations) in Apr '21
- Troughed at 31.78 (per 10k hospitalizations) in May '22



KEY FINDINGS

Emergency Department

- Demographically, All Drug-related ED visits in CY 2022 were mostly White/Caucasian (38%), Male (51%), 55 years and older (28%) and 35-54 years (23%), and from Honolulu county (58%).
- Monthly rates for All Drug-related ED visits (per 10,000 ED visits) decreased in CY 2022 (-11%); and decreased between CY'21 -'22 (-18.9%).


Figure 19. Number of ED Visits vs. All Drug, Opioid, and Stimulantinvolved ED Visits by Year, CYs 2018 –2022



Hospitalizations

- Demographically, All Drug-related hospitalizations in CY 2022 were mostly White/Caucasian (79%), Male (58 %), 55 years and older (53%) and from Honolulu county (34%).
- Monthly rates for All Drug-related hospitalizations (per 10,000 hospitalizations) decreased in CY 2022 (-11%); and decreased from CY'21 – '22 (-94%).
