OPERATIONS UPDATES - Q2 2023

- Realized sustained operations of 10 aircraft (9 fixed wing and 1 rotor wing aircraft) throughout the state, each staffed by Critical Care RN/Paramedic or Critical Care RN/RN flight teams for each transport
- HLF services are staffed with air medical crews, pilots, and aircraft physically stationed onisland at base locations (Kauai, Molokai, Maui, Kona, Waimea, Hilo) with back-up aircraft stationed in Honolulu to respond to each island
- Clinically staffed with 34 Flight RNs and 14 Flight Paramedics

TRAINING - Q2 2023

- Completed quarterly physician-led virtual didactic training on advanced airway management
- Completed quarterly advanced skills training check-offs at each base along with bi-annual equipment proficiency check-offs
- HLF Fixed-Wing Pilots conducted King-Air C90 live simulator training locally at the HLF Honolulu location in addition to remaining compliant with FAA training and check-rides
- HLF Fixed-Wing pilots completed safety training for new pre-flight risk assessment, enhanced flight acceptance procedures, and night operations
- HLF clinical staff completed annual didactic and live Aircraft Safety Training (April / May / June)
- Cardiac Assist Device Training: 28 of the HLF clinical staff completed Impella cardiac assist device training and competency verification. This allows our team to transport Impella cardiac assist device patients from any sending facility in the state with patients requiring this device

Operational Updates

o Since becoming part of HFD Medical Protocol in February, Naloxone has been administered by HFD personnel at 42 incidents.

Operations

- 10 additional boxes of Naloxone to be distributed to each Battalion Chief to aid in distribution demands.

Community outreach updates

- Working extensively with PHN to provide resources to patients who show the need for additional everyday assistance.
 - Example: Individual in Waipahu called 60+ times over a 6 week period.
 - Educating public on appropriate use of 911 resources. Utilizing protocol
 established by Corp Council where refusal of services may be implemented in
 a respectful and safe manner.
- Collaborating with community Urgent care and Private Practices to establish transfer of care protocols that support the best continuum of care for patients.

CPR Updates

- o HFD has responded to 351 CPR cases where our AED was applied as of 30 June 2023.
- o Patients by sex: Male 72.5%, Female 26.5%.
- Total Return of Spontaneous Circulation (ROSC) 68 (17.3%) overall.
- Total Saves 22 (5.6%)
- Total unknown Patient dispositions 63 (24.9%)

Community Bystander CPR Updates

- 44 training events as of 30 June 2023
- 1207 Civilians trained in Bystander "Hands-Only" CPR

Operations:

Staffing:

- o Since last report, FFD has on boarded 37 new recruit firefighters. Two (2) recruits released from class to date. One for academic standards and another was a voluntary drop on request. Five (5) of them are NREMT-P and HI licensed paramedics.
- o Projecting n=4 Firefighter/Paramedics reaching mandatory Federal age 57 retirements by the end of this calendar year. Another n=1 voluntary retirement with years of service. Lastly, n=1 transferred to another Federal Fire Department on mainland. (Spouse is active duty)

Equipment:

- o New leased GSA ambulance received. Ambulance is a Type I-AD, 2023 Ford F450 diesel chassis with 6.7L Power Stroke V8 Turbo Diesel. Apparatus is equipped with an external "cool bar" AC condenser systems with 30% greater condensing capability and 30% greater BTU capacity. Internally it is equipped with Stryker Power Load system, Power Pro XT cot; Medixsafe Wi-Fi enabled MS Series narcotics vault and Ziamatic electrical oxygen lift rack. Cylinders storage and retention systems are accessed via external compartments and are NTEA-Ambulance Manufactures Division (AMD) standard 003, SAE-J3043 and US Government General Service Administration (GSA) KKK ambulance specification approved.
- o Next phased replacement ambulance order placed and scheduled for delivery during FY24.
- o Received new Zoll Autopulse mechanical CPR device.

Training:

- Fire recruit class in progress.
 - o HAZMAT and NREMT testing completed.
 - o Didactic lectures for Firefighter I/II and Aircraft Firefighting completed. Class has moved on to fire ground practical skills evolutions with final live fire burn in first week of Sept.
 - o Recruits projected to graduate on 08SEP23.

- Hosted Honolulu Fire Departments (HFD) recruit class live fire flash over training.
 Burns were conducted at Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam (JBPHH) FFD training grounds.
- Completed training evolutions and requirements for JBPHH active shooter event.
- Completed HURREX 2023 training requirements for Navy Region Hawaii and Army Garrison Hawaii.
- Completed integrated medical response training exercise with USAF 15th Medical Group.
- Completed training evolutions and evaluation requirements with US Army Garrison Hawaii active shooter event at Schofield Barracks.
- Re-certified Auto Extrication Train the Trainer Couse instructors. Subject Matter Experts (SME) from Hurst eDraulics provided training and certifications.
- Completed Driver Operator/Engineer training provided by Pierce manufacturing on Saber and Contender model Engines to include chassis electrical, command zone and aerial electrical information.
- Completed shipboard familiarization and pre-fire planning requirements with homeported US Navy surface warfare vessels and submarines.
- Continued familiarization and coordinated training in alignment with Red Hill Joint Task Force command.
- Completed rated full scale radiological emergency response exercise with Naval Sea Systems Command.
- Completed training evolutions and requirements for USMC Lethal Breeze exercise at MCBH.
- Provided CPR/AED training to 60 plus active duty Red Hill fire watch Sailors and Marines in preparation for defueling operations.

• Training and Education

- o The Hawaii Fire Department's 32nd fire recruit class is schedule to begin on August 1, 2023. We have19 recruits in this class and they are projected to register for EMT training in the spring of 2024.
- Our Fall 2022 paramedic class personnel participated in the Kapiolani Community College graduation ceremony held on Friday June 30th.
- The Hawaii Fire Department continues to host paramedic preparation classes.
 Over the past two months the focus has been on primary assessments, sepsis and neurological emergencies.
- Emergency Medical Responder training was held in May for our newly hired
 Fire Communication Officer I employees.

Operations

- Our new Sapphire Medication pumps have been deployed to all of our stations and our personnel have been in-serviced.
- We have received alternative funding assistance for five LUCAS compression devices. These compression devices will be assigned to the stations listed below:
 - Haihai Fire Station
 - Kailua-Kona Fire Station
 - Keauhou Fire Station
 - Waikoloa Fire Station
 - Volcano Fire Station
- The Hawaii Fire Department provided a medical standby team at the 2023
 Ironman 70.3 Triathlon held at the Fairmont Orchid on Saturday June 3.
- Two Coin of Life recognition ceremonies were held in the month of May. This ceremony is held to celebrate prehospital cardiac arrest saves. At these events survivors are reunited with personnel involved in the save and also receive a Gold Coin of Life from the Hawaii Fire Department.

Community Education and Injury Prevention

- On May 9th HFD EMS personnel participated in the 2nd Annual Fentanyl and Addiction Summit in Waimea. EMS Branch personnel were featured as keynote speakers and also participated in an open forum Q&A session.
- o Hands Only CPR classes continue island wide. Approximately 250 people have been trained over the past two months.
