Operations:

Staffing:

- Since last report, FFD on boarded 37 new recruit firefighters. A total 30 completed the training program and graduated on 08SEP23. Five (5) of them are NREMT-P and Hawaii licensed paramedics.
- o Recruitment for the next class has begun. 26 Firefighter/EMT positions opened on 01NOV23 only. 4 Firefighter/Paramedic opened via USA Jobs on 13OCT and closed on 23OCT23.
- o Two (2) Firefighter/Paramedics reached mandatory Federal retirement age of age 57 in SEP23. Another (1) Firefighter/Paramedic will reach mandatory Federal retirement age in DEC23.
- o Lastly, one (1) Firefighter/Paramedic transferred to a mainland Fire Department. Spouse is active duty.

New leased General Services Administration (GSA) ambulance received. Ambulance is a Type I-AD, 2023 Ford F450 diesel chassis with 6.7L Power Stroke V8 Turbo Diesel. Apparatus is equipped with an external "cool bar" AC condenser systems with 30% greater condensing capability and 30% greater BTU capacity. Internally it is equipped with Stryker Power Load system, Power Pro XT cot; Medixsafe Wi-Fi enabled MS Series narcotics vault and Ziamatic electrical oxygen lift rack. Cylinders storage and retention systems are accessed via external compartments and are NTEA-Ambulance Manufactures Division (AMD) standard 003, SAE-J3043 and US Government General Service Administration (GSA) KKK ambulance specification approved.

EMSAC Report November 20, 2023

Training and Education

- The Hawaii Fire Department's 32nd fire recruit class is scheduled to begin EMT training in January 2024.
- The Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support recertification process has been completed.
- The fail 2023 MICT class has completed MICT 171. The students have begun MICT 181.
- Active shooter training was held on November 7th 9th. This multi-agency training included the Hawaii County Police Department and the Hawaii Fire Department, and was held at the Hawaii Community College Campus. A total of 50 personnel participated in this training.
- Our NREMT recertification and reimbursement process has commenced.
- o Our FERNO technician team has completed their recertification process.

Operations

- o The EMS Branch attended the Hawai'i Island Healthcare Conference held at the Westin Hapuna Beach Resort on October 5th. Representatives from hospitals, clinics, and social service agencies statewide attended the event this year. The focus of the conference was on disaster relief and interagency cooperation.
- Five Candidates participated in the Fire Medical Specialist II promotional assessment center on October 17th. We would like to congratulate our newly promoted personnel:

- O HFD personnel from Fire Administration, EMS Branch, and HFD Operations provided EMS support at Ironman 2023. Approximately 2,100 athletes participated in this year's event. The majority of incidents requiring HFD EMS involvement were post-race symptoms from the participants. The presence of HFD at the event to assess, treat, and coordinate with the medical tent personnel resulted in minimal impact to the 911 system.
- The Hawai'i Fire Department's new aeromedical helicopter was put into service in September. Mahalo to all the hospitals on the Big Island for allowing access to their helipads for the island wide training.
- The Hawai'i Fire Department purchased ESO Inventory Software. This
 program will enhance EMS operations and inventory management by
 - 1. An electronic confirmation of controlled drug inventory count during change of shift. This replaces the pen & paper method of inventory tracking
 - Supervisors will be alerted if controlled substances inventory has not been completed
 - 2. All EMS equipment inventory count is adjusted in real-time from completed prehospital reports
 - 3. Effective delivery of supplies to EMS units maximizing proper distribution of resources

ESO will be training the Hawai'i Fire Department EMS Branch in November or December prior to department wide implementation to all ambulance units

• Community Education and Injury Prevention

- Hands Only CPR (HOCPR) classes continue island wide. Approximately 200 people have been trained over the past two months.
- On September 11 the EMS Branch personnel taught HOCPR to 40 pickle ball players, many of whom were present at a cardiac arrest save a few months prior to the training.
- In the month of October, 20 members of the Community Action Network, which is made up of various social services and charitable organizations, converged in Kona for HOCPR training and a fire safety awareness class.

3rd Quarter report (July through September 2023)

Operations

- Responded to 1,520 medical calls for service
- 88% of patient contacts made were residents versus 12% visitors
- Of the 1,520 medical calls for service FD personnel arrived first on scene 96% of the time
- There were 50 cardiac arrest cases with 4 resuscitations to discharge (8%)
- Bystander CPR was reported 34% of time
- Narcan was indicated & administered on 23 calls for service

Training

OPERATIONS UPDATES - Q3 2023

- HLF expanded its leadership team in August, adding 2 new operational Program Directors. Please join us in welcoming Jessica Hyatt (Program Director for Kaua'i, Honolulu, Maui County bases) and Jacob Mayer (Program Director for Big Island air bases and AMR Maui Medevac)
- Mark Leggett became Director of Service Delivery, responsible for regulatory and compliance matters, external customer relationships, and state EMS and hospital stakeholder relations
- Continued sustained operations of 9 aircraft (8 fixed wing and 1 rotor wing aircraft) throughout the state, each staffed by Critical Care RN/Paramedic or Critical Care RN/RN flight teams for each transport
- HLF services are staffed with air medical crews, pilots, and aircraft physically stationed on-island at base locations (Kauai, Molokai, Maui, Kona, Waimea, Hilo) with back-up aircraft stationed in Honolulu to respond to each island
- Clinically staffed with 32 Flight RNs and 14 Flight Paramedics

TRAINING - Q3 2023

- Completed quarterly physician-led virtual didactic training on advanced airway management
- Completed quarterly advanced skills training check-offs at each base along with bi-annual equipment proficiency check-offs
- HLF Fixed-Wing Pilots conducted King-Air C90 live simulator training locally at the HLF Honolulu location in addition to remaining compliant with FAA training and check-rides
- HLF Fixed-Wing pilots completed safety training for new pre-flight risk assessment, enhanced flight acceptance procedures, and night operations
- HLF clinical staff completed annual didactic and live Aircraft Safety Training (August / September / October)
