Hawaii DOH 2023 Updated Syphilis Screening Recommendations

Specific Population	Screening Recommendation
Pregnant Persons	 All pregnant persons should be screened three times: At first prenatal care visit (or as early as possible during their pregnancy) At 24-32 weeks of gestation At delivery*
	 Pregnant persons who present late for prenatal care or have fragmented care, should be screened for syphilis and other STIs (chlamydia, gonorrhea and HIV) whenever they present at any healthcare setting (e.g. ED, urgent care, jail, substance use treatment facility). Screening should be performed in cases of fetal demise at greater than 20 weeks gestation.
Non-pregnant Persons	Sexually active ⁺ non-pregnant persons should be screened at least annually and whenever they present for care (up to every 3-6 months) based on increased risk of infection.
 Persons who may become pregnant 	Example risk indicators include: Illicit substance use such as methamphetamine or nonprescription opioids
 Males who have sex with females 	 Homeless or unstable housing History of transactional sex Current or prior incarceration
 Males who have sex with males 	 History of STIs (chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis, or HIV) Multiple or anonymous sex partners Use of HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) Condomless sex with a partner of unknown STI status
 Transgender or gender diverse persons who have sex with males 	 People with a sex partner with any of the above risks should be screened at least annually. Females whose male partners have sex with both males and females should be screened annually.

Medical providers should be especially vigilant in following these recommendations when caring for Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander patients as syphilis has disproportionately affected these communities.
