### ANNUAL FEES AND PENALTIES FOR FAILING TO REPORT

HEPCRA and its implementing rules at Title 11, Chapter 453, Hawai`i Administrative Rules (HAR) requires businesses to pay an annual \$100 filing fee with submission of each Tier II facility report. HEPCRA and its implementing rules also include significant penalties and fines that may be assessed to businesses that fail to submit required Tier II reports.

# SHOULD YOU BE REPORTING HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES OR CHEMICALS FOR YOUR COMPANY?

If your business handles hazardous chemicals, hazardous substances, or extremely hazardous substances (EHSs), then you may be required to submit an annual HEPCRA Tier II Chemical Inventory report to the Hawai'i Department of Health (DOH).
