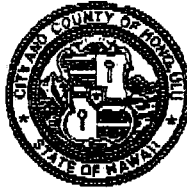

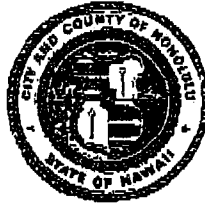

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the federal Emergency
2 Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act ("EPCRA") was signed by
3 the President in October 1986. The Act was intended to improve
4 the planning and response effort of all communities to properly
5 and adequately respond to hazardous materials incidents.

6 The governor in each state appoints members to a state
7 emergency response commission which establishes local emergency
8 planning districts and appoints members to local emergency
9 planning committees. The local emergency planning committee in
10 each planning district develops emergency response plans to deal
11 with hazardous materials incidents, gathers information on the
12 facilities within the district, and assists in disseminating
13 information to the public on chemicals present in the district.

14 In response to the federal act the governor signed the
15 Hawaii emergency planning and community right-to-know Act, which
16 defines membership of the state emergency response commission,
17 designates the counties as local emergency planning committees,
18 and establishes filing fees of \$100 for each chemical inventory
19 form submitted to the state emergency response commission.

1 The legislature finds that the federal government did not
2 provide assistance to the state emergency response commissions or
3 the local emergency planning committees in developing and
4 implementing plans or programs.

5 The purpose of this Act is to establish funding for the
6 local emergency planning committees in order for them to plan,
7 prepare, and respond to hazardous material emergencies
8 encountered in their districts.

9 SECTION 2. Section 128D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

11 "(b) Moneys from the fund shall be expended by the
12 department for response actions, including removal and remedial
13 actions, consistent with this chapter; provided that the revenues
14 generated by the "environmental response tax" and deposited into
15 the environmental response revolving fund:

16 (1) Shall be used:

17 (A) For oil spill planning, prevention, preparedness,
18 education, research, training, removal, and
19 remediation; and

20 (B) For direct support for county used oil recycling
21 programs;

22 and

1 (2) May also be used to address concerns related to
2 drinking water, underground storage tanks, including
3 support for the underground storage tank program of the
4 department and funding for the acquisition by the State
5 of a soil remediation site and facility[.];
6 provided further that moneys from the filing fees received under
7 section 128E-9 and deposited into the environmental response fund
8 shall be expended in the form of grants to the local emergency
9 planning committees established under section 128E-5 for the
10 improvement of hazardous materials emergency planning,
11 preparedness, and response."

12 SECTION 3. Section 128E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

14 "(g) The commission shall:

- 15 (1) Carry out the duties and responsibilities of a state
16 emergency response commission as specified in the
17 Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of
18 1986;
- 19 (2) Develop state contingency plans relating to the
20 implementation of this chapter;
- 21 (3) Supervise, coordinate, and provide staff support to the
22 committees for the implementation of this chapter and

- 1 the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act
2 of 1986;
- 3 (4) Develop a public information, education, and
4 participation program for the public and facility
5 owners covering the requirements of this chapter, and
6 the interpretation of the chemical information
7 collected pursuant to this chapter and the risks that
8 these chemicals pose to the public health and
9 environment;
- 10 (5) Appoint the members of the committees;
- 11 (6) Develop a state chemical inventory form to be used in
12 lieu of the federal Tier II form and chemical list
13 requirements; [and]
- 14 (7) Develop guidelines for the submission by local
15 emergency planning committees of proposals for projects
16 that improve hazardous materials emergency planning,
17 preparedness, and response;
- 18 (8) Approve or disapprove proposals for funding; and
- 19 [(7)] (9) Do all other things necessary for the
20 implementation of this chapter and the requirements of
21 the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act
22 of 1986."

1 SECTION 4. Section 128E-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) The department of health, with the assistance of the
4 department of budget and finance and department of accounting and
5 general services, shall prepare a report for the legislature
6 concerning the amount of moneys collected during the preceding
7 fiscal year, the amount of moneys collected to date during the
8 current fiscal year, and the amount of moneys to be collected
9 during the upcoming fiscal year, pursuant to sections 128E-9 and
10 128E-11[, and accruing to the credit of the state general fund].
11 The department shall submit the foregoing report to the
12 legislature not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
13 each regular session of the legislature."

14 SECTION 5. Section 128E-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 "[~~§~~128E-9] Filing fees[.] and grants. (a) Facilities
17 that are required to report according to section 128E-6(a)(2),
18 shall remit \$100 with each submission of chemical inventory forms
19 or Tier II forms to the commission by March 1 of each year. All
20 moneys collected by the department pursuant to this section shall
21 be deposited [in the state treasury and accrue to the credit of
22 the state general fund.] to the credit of environmental response

1 revolving fund established in section 128D-2 and shall be used by
2 the commission to make grants to local emergency planning
3 committees for the purpose of improving local hazardous materials
4 emergency planning, preparedness, and response.

5 (b) The commission shall develop guidelines for grant
6 proposals submitted by the local emergency planning committees."

7 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed.
8 New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

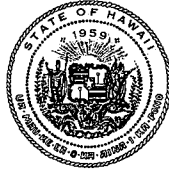

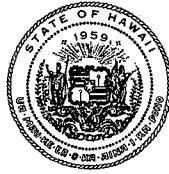

The motion to accept the minutes with above change was carried by a unanimous vote.

2. **Mike Ardito**, from the Office of Emergency Planning, U.S. EPA Region IX, presented a review of the February LEPC Peer Exchange and the Nationwide LEPC Survey and an overview of the Hawaii Risk Assessment.

RC-HSERC Members were not notified of this meeting because only LEPC members were included in the limited scope.
CD-Legislative representation was very important.
JS-Mainland viewpoint was valuable.
RP-Civil Defense should review.
BA-All members will receive copies for comment.
3. **Marsha Mealey**, of the HEER Office, updated the commission on the Section 312 filing status for the reporting year 1994.
\$81,500 in filing fees has been collected to date. Many facilities have petroleum products only; 264 facilities are service stations, 27 are terminals and 101 are propane only. There are 37 military facilities, which under the current fee structure, are nonpaying facilities.
4. **Steve Armann**, Manager of the HEER Office, gave an update of the activities of the Regional Response Team (RRT).
The RRT worked out a policy for in situ burning and preapproves the use of dispersants in the event of a major oil spill. Co-chaired by the USCG and the EPA for coastal and inland responses. The CG is approving vessel response plans for oil spills. Since HQ in DC is reviewing the plans they are allowing plans citing companies which do not have resources readily available in the Pacific. A letter from the Governor to the Commandant of the Coast Guard District here is being drafted expressing the concern that since mainland companies, not local companies are cited in the plans, funds to support local readiness may be lost.
5. **Al Kang**, of the State Civil Defense, described the upcoming HazMat exercise, Operation Diamond

Head, here in Hawaii.

6. **Leighton Au Cook**, State Civil Defense, spoke about HazMat training in the state.
7. LEPC Representatives updated the commission on county emergency planning activities.

1. **Jay Sasan**, Hawaii

Member ship updates listed in a memo titled "Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) Members" dated June 9, 1995 from Jay Sasan to Mayor Stephen K. Yamashiro.
Funding for and ready access to training programs are a concern.

2. **Clifford Ikeda**, Kauai

Member ship updates listed in a letter titled "Kaua'i LEPC Membership" dated August 14, 1995 from Mayor Maryanne W. Kusaka to the State of Hawai'i Emergency Response Commission.
A motion was made, amended, and carried to adopt both the Hawaii and Kauai County membership updates.

3. **Joe Blackburn**, Maui

The LEPC is to finalize the Maui Emergency Action Plan and will then resume meetings.

4. **Carter Davis**, Oahu

Oahu is rewriting its EOP and sending it for review.

Budget issues are a concern.

Legislative participation is critical for LEPCs.

Exercise will bring together 3 technician teams including Hickam Federal Fire Team.

Thurs. 17th of August is the next scheduled meeting of the Honolulu LEPC.

8. **Mike Cripps'** presentation of the HEER Office Investigation of Explosive Conditions in Waikiki was postponed until after the formal meeting to allow time for voting on the establishment of subcommittees.
9. **Steve Armann** proposed the establishment of subcommittees to facilitate HSERC business.

The motion was made and carried to established the following subcommittees:

Planning, Exercise and Training with Civil Defense as the lead.

Legislation, Policy and Funding with DOH as the lead.


Business, Industry and Information Management with Carter Davis as the lead and a position for industry.

Maui Cost Recovery - Maui County has been reimbursed for the NAPA Fire response.

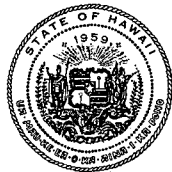
Legislative Briefing - Title 11 Chapter 451 has been signed by the Governor.

2. Capt. Carter Davis narrated a unedited version of the video from the August Full Scale Exercise.
 - a. A faster response for the victims would be desirable.
 - b. Incident Command - Scene Management probably was the aspect of the implementation which slowed the process.
 - c. Unified Command was in effect.
 - d. There was a good relationship with HIOSH at the exercise.
 - e. Gary Gill asked if there are enough Level A suits available. Carter Davis answered that the C&C of Honolulu has 10 'state of the art' Suits.
 - f. This brought up the question of how the outer islands were set for Level A.
 - i) HEER will be doing a capabilities study and will report their findings to the Legislature.
 - ii) Roy Price pointed out that Civil Defense can move resources from an unaffected area.
 - iii) In the event of a multiple island disaster, the HEER office is Level A backup.
 - iv) Jay Sasan noted that planning in Hawaii is for Level B
3. It was noted that (under Chapter 92, The Sunshine Act) whenever two or more commission members meet, there must first be a notice of public meeting posted. Comments were heard from each of the leads of the subcommittees established at the last meeting.

Steve Armann, HEER Office Manager

Need specific topics for the subcommittee to pursue. EPA, State and Coast Guard HazMat plans need to be consolidated.

Carter Davis, Honolulu Fire Department

In October, a meeting was held between private, state, and county interested individuals regarding information management. The best direction appears to be: use a single POC for EPCRA data, use ArcInfo as the interface for geographical data, make use of the Maui Supercomputer has to offer, and get data out quickly to the public. Since the HSERC, LEPCs, Fire Departments, Civil Defense, DOT and city planning use different platforms, a data management standard is needed to assure access to information gathered under HEPCRA. There are resources which the committee should try to utilize: the WWW, local companies who may allow storage as a community service, MSDSs on the internet and programming help from UH.

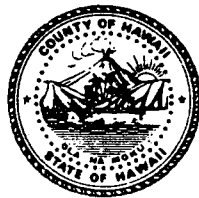



Implications for Program Improvement for the State of Hawaii

Conference speakers provided advice from their experience conducting SERC activities in their states. Each of their free or low cost suggestions will be put into place by the HSERC and HEER Office to improve the efficiency of State and Local chemical emergency planning without increasing spending.

Narrative

As a result of the information presented in the conference, the HEER office will contact additional agencies to improve interdepartmental efforts in the event of an actual chemical emergency. We'll also publish the state toll free number to encourage chemical reporting, follow up, and question calls. And, as the HEER Office increases enforcement activities, the HSERC will be involved with any suits from the start so that monies collected from penalties can be channeled to support LEPCs.

Other suggestions which will be implemented are:

All SERC subcommittees should have LEPC representation.

Develop 10 simple requirements for adequate function.

Present awards to LEPC chairs whose committees meet 10 basic requirements of a fully functioning LEPC.

When evaluating preplanning for terrorist chemical attacks, be sure that the following are done:

Talk to the Poison Control Center about obtaining large quantities of antidotes,

Contact the FBI Domestic Office in your jurisdiction and make sure that the SERC is in the planning loop for terrorist activities (exercises, etc.), and

Find out who receives the threat warning in your state so that the SERC may be on the notification list.

Identify and harden potential targets (for example, fence one ton chlorine cylinders).

Police and Fire will be the first called; make sure that they are prepared.

Contact Bud Ward for a member of the Environmental Journalists Society who can organize a local meeting to educate journalists on issues in environmental reporting.

Have LEPCs speak to friendly groups first, such as the JCs and NSC to practice public relations skills.

Providing a 1(800) number will greatly improve facility and public contact with the department.

Obtain TRI downloading software from the hotline so that the state can accept electronic data.

Send LEPCs the TRI reports for their jurisdiction.

The Risk Management Plan required by the Clean Air Act is a summary of the facility's hazard assessment, prevention program and the response plan. Plans prepared under the CAA should satisfy EPCRA response plan requirements.

Propane, ammonia and chlorine represent 70% of regulated chemicals. Emergency preparedness should reflect this. Perhaps 10% of EPCRA reporters will also be covered by the accident reduction and prevention requirements of the CAA.

Make surveys easy to fill out. Preprint information that your department already has.

LEPCs can benefit from Supplemental Environmental Programs (SEP) associated with penalties for non compliance:

- Donations of Computers, SCBA, etc. to LEPCs

- Host a conference

- Chair the LEPC in their jurisdiction

- Outreach programs such as newsletters

- Do chemical safety audits

- Comply early with CAA 112r requirements

- Meet 112r requirements even if facility doesn't exceed thresholds

- Attend LEPC meetings

Set up an accounting system through the SERC so that money from penalties can go back to the LEPC and the community.

Have industry reps available as consultants for other industry personnel.

Use Tier II software to allow electronic submission.

Collect geographic information to use with Marplot revisions.
