

Pillars of Disaster Readiness

CAT is addressing several broad categories of actions that will increase Hawai'i's ability to withstand and recover from future climate shocks and other natural disasters:

Resilience

Environmental Restoration and protection of natural systems can reduce the impact of severe weather events on our communities. Investment in our environment benefits all residents, especially by preventing and reducing devastation.

Much of the state's commercial and residential infrastructure is not built to withstand the kinds of storms that are now becoming commonplace. There are cost-effective investments in infrastructure that can reduce the loss of life, shelter and economic activity in the event of a natural disaster.

Infrastructure

Physical/Social Physical impacts from future natural disasters are inevitable and may be devastating. Preparing for recovery is essential and must address physical repairs to harbor, roadway, educational, utility and other public infrastructure as well as residences. Social and emotional recovery may be even more challenging.

Recovery


Financial/Insurance Economic damages from climate events and the associated cost of insurance is expensive for many and unavailable for others. We must develop strategies for filling gaps in coverage and accelerating access to funds in the event of a natural disaster.


