PROPANE SAFETY REMINDERS



UPRIGHT

Always store and secure/ transport tank(s) in an upright position.





TRANSPORT

Do not transport more than four (4) propane cyclinders in an enclosed vehicle or more than 90 pounds total, with no one container greater than 45 pounds.

SECURE TANK

Ensure tank is properly secured and does not move around.





NO SMOKING

Do not leave cylinders inside vehicle unattended.

 - Propane tanks (up to 10 gallons or 40 lbs) may be empty, full, or partially full and with valves intact. For larger tanks greater than 10 gallons there is a fee.
