REPORT ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE REVOLVING FUND
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, and
Chapter 128E, HRS Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act

This report, prepared by the State of Hawaii Department of Health (DOH), Environmental Health Administration (EHA), Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office, complies with the Hawaii Environmental Response Law (HERL), Chapters 128D and 128E, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) requiring the DOH to report to the State Legislature on the Environmental Response Law and Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (HEPCRA).

The report presents the Fiscal Year 2025 accounting of Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) budget and expenditures for five Environmental Health Administration (EHA) programs. The report also presents an accounting of Chapter 128E, HRS, HEPCRA Tier II filing fees collected and distributed for FY2025.

ERRF Supports Environmental Health Administration

Prior to FY2016, the ERRF funded five Environmental Health Administration (EHA) programs with 31 occupied positions. They are the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office, Environmental Management Division (EMD), Clean Water Branch (CWB), Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), and the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB). Due to rapidly declining barrel tax revenues, the 2015 Legislature changed the means of financing for all 31 occupied positions from ERRF to general funds and eliminated 10 vacant positions, effective July 1, 2015. The legislative changes enacted removed certain uses of the fund, returning the focus to removal, remediation, and detection of oil and pollutant or contaminant releases; and removal and remediation of hazardous waste and any other solid, liquid, or gaseous substance that may harm the environment. Concurrently, the 2015 Legislature reduced the corresponding 2016 appropriations to the affected programs: HEER <\$1,132,230>, CWB <\$324,891>, SDWB <\$457,532>, and SHWB <\$892,793>.

Revenue

ERRF generates revenue in variable amounts during any given year from the fines, penalties, and interest earned by the environmental programs. A primary source of funding for the ERRF is the 5-cent share of the “environmental response tax” (ERT) which levies a \$1.05 tax on each barrel of oil shipped into Hawaii.

The General Fund receives sixty cents of the barrel tax. The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT), Energy Security Special Fund and the Energy Systems Development Fund, and the Hawaii Department of Agriculture (DOA), Agricultural Development and Food Security Special Fund receive the remaining 40 cents.

In 2015, the Legislature expanded HRS Section 243-3.5(b)(1) to include other fossil fuels by levying a 19-cent tax on each one million British thermal units (MMBtu) of fossil fuel sold by a distributor. The Department of Taxation (DOTAX) Annual Reports for the fiscal years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024 state that the tax was levied on 7.9, 5.9, 4.6, 5.3, 6.3 and 5.8 million MMBtu of non-petroleum fossil fuels respectively. The ERRF is allocated a 4.8 per cent share of this additional tax revenue.

In addition, fines and penalties generated by the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office, Clean Water Branch (CWB), Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB), Clean Air Branch (CAB), and the Indoor and Radiological Health Branch (IRHB) are deposited into the ERRF. ERT revenue to DOH in FY2025 was \$1,297,028 which includes fossil fuel collections. Total revenue to the ERRF, including the ERT revenue, was \$2,088,912.

Budget and Expenditure

The 2024 legislature appropriated \$1,776,107 for operating expenses to the Environmental Management Division (EMD) and Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office. The state expended \$1,054,613 of the ERRF during FY25 for the four programs.

Environmental Response Tax Revenue Relatively Stable

The \$1.05 per barrel ERT revenue to DOH's environmental programs is relatively stable over the past five fiscal years. For fiscal years 2021, and 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025 ERT revenue was: \$1,248,675, \$1,116,240, \$1,313,431, \$1,306,010, and \$1,297,028 respectively. Note that effective fiscal year 2016 the ERT revenue includes fossil fuel collections.

2015 Legislative Changes to HRS 128D and HRS 243 to Affect ERRF in FY2016

In July 2015, Governor Ige signed into law revisions to Section §128D-2 to limit the uses of the fund. In addition, revisions to §243-3.5(b)(1) modified the Environmental Response, Energy and Food Security Tax to add a 19-cent tax on each one million British thermal units (MMBtu) of fossil fuels and to allocate 4.8 per cent of said tax to the ERRF. The change in the means of finance for the 31 occupied positions from ERRF to general funds also took effect in July 2015. Accordingly, the Legislature adjusted the ERRF appropriations to the affected EHA programs. Another provision was that unexpended and unencumbered funds in excess of \$1,250,000 remaining in the fund after June 30 of each fiscal year will be transferred to the general fund. Changes affecting the ERRF have been reported in detail in this Report.

Hawaii State Response Program Impacted by Federal Budget Cuts

Because ERRF funding does not fully support the state's response obligation, the HEER Office implements the environmental site identification, assessment, and cleanup program using combined ERRF, General Fund, and federal cooperative agreement funding.

The State Response Program Grant allocation for the last five years are as follows: \$860,000 in FY2022, \$860,000 in FY2023, \$800,000 in FY2024, \$400,000 in FY25, and \$550,000 in FY26. The allocations of the smaller Preliminary Assessment/Site Investigation (PA/SI) grant for the past five years were, \$275,000 in FY2022, \$275,000 in FY2023, \$245,000 in FY2024, \$245,000 in FY2025, and \$270,000 in FY2026. Grant allocations for FY2027 remain to be determined.

Given the relatively stable ERT revenue levels and substantial reductions in federal funding it is hoped that the additional funding from the 19-cent tax on

each MMBtu of fossil fuels of which the ERRF is allocated 4.8 percent will help to offset the losses.

The Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) Site Lists

This annual report presents four distinct Site Lists at the end of this document.

First, per HRS 128D, this annual report identifies Sites Eligible for Possible Remedial Action Under the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA).

Secondly, the *FY2025 Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) Chemical Release Notification Log* lists 471 release notifications managed by the HEER Office State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs). HEER identified 283 cases directly related to petroleum releases.

Thirdly, the *Hawaii State Response Program List of Priority Sites* presents all non-military Hawaii sites identified for potential or known non-emergency response actions under HRS 128D. The list shows 1121 active sites under direct DOH oversight in the various State programs. This includes four sites with known or suspected contamination that were open or received No Further Action (NFA) determinations since the beginning of FY2025.

Finally, the *Hawaii State Response Program Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program List of Priority Sites* presents a list of 546 military sites in Hawaii for which HEER's Site Discovery and Remediation (SDAR) section provides oversight. This includes one site with known or suspected contamination that received NFA determination.

SDAR provides regulatory oversight of hazardous substance response actions for Department of Defense (DOD) service branches under federal CERCLA authorities and HRS 128D. Sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance sites (UXO), and multiple diverse military operations, including tank farms, pipelines, industrial activities and active training sites. A DOD cooperative agreement funds investigation, cleanup and DOH oversight of most military sites under EPA CERCLA authority. Investigation and cleanup of petroleum-contaminated military sites are exempt under CERCLA and are conducted under HRS 128D authority. Cleanup and DOH oversight for petroleum related activities are also covered under the cooperative funding agreements.

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REPORT ON CHAPTER HRS 128D, HRS, ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE LAW (HERL)

Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) Budget Report

The Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law (HERL) annual report to the Thirty-Second Legislature, State of Hawaii, presents an accounting of Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) revenue and monies budgeted and expended for implementing environmental protection and response plans and actions.

ERRF Uses

In accordance with HRS 128D, the ERRF may be used for the following:

- (1) Removal, remediation, and detection of oil and pollutant or contaminant releases;
- (2) Removal and remediation of hazardous waste and any other solid, liquid, or gaseous substance that may harm the environment; and
- (3) The payment of expenditures authorized by the Director under section 128D-4, Uses of the Fund.

Special Funding to Attorney General

The ERRF funds legal support from the state Department of Attorney General on a variety of regulatory oversight issues including issuing orders to noncompliant parties, negotiating agreements with Voluntary Response Program participants, providing legal guidance on program development and legislative proposals, and developing guidance for property owners on implementation of deed

restrictions in accordance with Hawaii's Uniform Environmental Covenant Act.

Annual de minimis Settlements

Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, requires that the department report annually on any de minimis settlements. During FY2025, there were no de minimis settlements.

Four Environmental Health Program Budgets

Four DOH environmental programs share revenue deposited to the ERRF and have access to the following appropriation amounts: The Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office \$1,363,895 and the Environmental Management Division, which includes the Clean Water Branch (CWB), Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), and Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB), \$412,212 for a total FY2025 allocation of \$1,776,107.

For FY2025 the legislature appropriated \$1,776,107 for operating expenses to the Environmental Management Division (EMD) and the HEER Office.

For FY2025 the state expended \$1,054,612 to the four programs. The operational expenses were for emergency and non-emergency environmental response contractors, salary and fringe benefits, travel, response training, standby and overtime pay, legal services, and Tier II Fees distributed to the county LEPCs.

Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) HEPCRA Budget Report

In compliance with Chapter 128E, HRS, Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (HEPCRA), this annual report to the Thirty-Third Legislature, State of Hawaii, 2026 presents the accounting of Tier II fee amounts as follows:

HEPCRA Facility Reporting and Fees

HEPCRA facilities are those that store, use, or manufacture above defined thresholds, any hazardous substance, or extremely hazardous substance. An owner or operator of a HEPCRA facility must file notification of such “Tier II” activity and pay a \$200 filing fee annually. HEER Office staff assesses each submitted Tier II report,

records the HEPCRA facility data into the EPA Tier II Submit database and processes the fees for deposit to the Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF).

DOH distributed the deposited Tier II filing fees to the Hawaii State Emergency Response Commission (HSERC) and the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) for operating expenditures. The annual amounts distributed to the LEPCs are based on Tier II fees collected from two fiscal years prior and after HSERC operating expenditures have been deducted.

As of June 30, 2025, there are 890 qualifying Tier II facilities. Military facilities must submit Tier II information but are exempt from filing fees.

The HSERC, LEPCs, and HEER Office are continuing efforts to identify and contact possible non-reporting facilities through community outreach and facility inspections.

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**THE HAZARD EVALUATION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE OFFICE
HAWAII STATE RESPONSE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION**

The HEER Office Mission

The mission of the HEER Office and the Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) is to address all aspects of releases of hazardous substances and pollutants, including oil, into the environment. HEER Office work includes preventing, planning for, and responding to hazardous substance releases, or risks of releases. HEER accomplishes this mission by responding rapidly to new spills and addressing existing contaminated sites with the highest risk to human health and the environment first, preventing contamination rather than cleaning up after the fact, and basing decisions on sound scientific principles and common sense.

The Hawaii State Response Program

ERRF funding to the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office is used for operational costs for the office's implementing program, the HSRP. Three operating sections address important focus areas of the HSRP. They are the 1) Emergency Preparedness and Response (EP&R) Section, 2) Hazard Evaluation (HE) Section, and the 3) Site Discovery, Assessment and Remediation (SDAR) Section.

The HSRP provides for oversight of assessment and cleanup activities during chemical emergencies, and on high and medium priority contaminated sites across the Hawaiian Islands. These include privately owned, municipal, and state-owned properties, and federal military sites. DOH has generally curtailed oversight of low priority sites, which pose little hazard, due to state budget constraints.

HEER staff works with property owners, the environmental community, developers, the public, and other state and federal agencies to implement solutions for eliminating risk of chemical exposure to humans and the environment. HSRP examples of work performed are as follows:

Emergency response to releases of hazardous substances that pose an imminent danger to people or the environment.

Non-emergency response actions on properties presumed or known to pose a risk to human health and/or the environment because of contamination with hazardous substances.

Identification and inspection of sites storing and using hazardous chemicals on property.

Performing ecological and human health risk assessment in the areas of toxicological assessments of chemical threats to human health.

Establishing appropriate cleanup levels for chemical contamination.

Assisting the public and responsible parties with access to information such as:

Health effects of chemicals
Public Record documents
Technical guidance and reference materials for cleaning up contaminated sites
Ongoing development and management of site related electronic records.

Environmental policy, law, and rule development.

Essential Federal Funding Support to the HSRP

As a result of legislative changes made in 2015, the ERRF no longer funds core operations for the HEER Office, and the General Fund currently supports approximately 40% of the HEER Office state response program obligations. Consequently, the HEER Office relies heavily on three cooperative agreement sources of federal funding to implement the office's mission and the HSRP.

The federal funding sources are the EPA State Response Program (SRP), the EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection (PA/SI) Cooperative Agreements, and the Department of Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Cooperative Agreement.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) State Response Program (SRP) Cooperative Agreement

The HEER Office continues to receive funding from the EPA State Response Program (SRP) grant under Section 128(a) of the Small Business Liability Relief and Brownfields Revitalization Act (SBLRBRA) of 2002. This SRP grant provides crucial funds for staff salaries, capacity building, and program development activities. The SRP grant awards have been steadily declining from 2011. The SRP grant allocation for the past five years are as follows: \$849,600 in FY2021, \$860,000 in FY2022, \$860,000 FY2023, \$800,000 in FY2024, and \$400,000 in FY2025.

EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection (PA/SI) Cooperative Agreement

The EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection Grant funds site discovery efforts combined with federal CERCLA (Superfund) evaluation of sites. HEER staff evaluates and rates sites based on PA/SI system criteria to determine their eligibility for the National Priority List. When a rated site scores too low to be eligible for the National Priority List of Sites, EPA transfers site-oversight responsibility from the EPA to the State of Hawaii. This year, the HEER Office used the \$245,000 PA/SI grant to fund positions, conduct field-screening activities, and fund laboratory costs to complete rapid site screenings that assess residential areas that may have been affected by historic releases of pesticides and other contaminants.

Department of Defense/State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Cooperative Agreement:

The HEER Office participates in two federal cleanup programs. The office provides oversight services to the military on sites located on federal property and managed and funded under the Department of Defense/State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program. HEER Office also manages assessment and cleanup activities for sites delegated to the DSMOA funded Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS).

The federal government established the DSMOA program to cover reimbursement of costs incurred by the state in providing oversight services to the Department of Defense (DOD) installations conducting environmental cleanup activities funded under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program (DERP). DSMOA funds are given to the state based on the state's request for advanced or reimbursement payment. The DSMOA Cooperative Agreement funds all staff positions overseeing remedial investigations and cleanups under these two DOD programs.

For FY2025, the state's reimbursement under DSMOA was \$604,773.

Modern Data Management and Hazard Tracking Tools

Residual contamination exists at hundreds of sites in Hawaii. Identifying these sites to ensure that unhealthy exposures are not occurring is a shared responsibility of the HEER Office and the affected property owners. The HEER Office has converted many of its public records to electronic format to

make them easily available to the public in accordance with Hawaii's Sunshine Law.

A HEER/UH Contract for Analytical Laboratory Service

Since 1998, the HEER Office has contracted with the University of Hawaii (UH) to characterize unknown hazardous substances. The successful collaboration allows for quick identification of chemical pollutant unknowns while conducting an emergency response action. The HEER Office is currently in year one a five-year contract with UH, effective May 1, 2024 until April 30, 2029. In addition to analyzing unknown substances, the university laboratory staff assists in training and outreach to Fire HazMat teams throughout the State.

Cost Recovery

Chapter 128D, HRS, provides legal authority to cost recover all ERRF expenses for DOH response actions. The HEER Office mechanisms for cost recovery require charging billable staff time and expenses to the ERRF and include following:

Responsible Party Agreement: DOH recovers oversight expenses for the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation, Honolulu Harbor, Hickam Community Housing, and GASCO cleanup sites in accordance with the terms of their respective Agreements for Remedial Action.

Fast Track Agreement: Parties wishing to receive expedited oversight of investigation and cleanup of low and medium priority sites have the option to enter into Fast Track Agreements, in which they pay oversight costs in return for face-to-face meetings and expedited document reviews.

Voluntary Response Program Agreement: DOH recovers oversight expenses for VRP and other cleanup sites in accordance with the terms of their respective HRS 128D Part II Voluntary Response Program Agreements for Remedial Action.

Emergency Response Action Expenditures: Money spent for responding to a chemical emergency is cost recoverable, only when expended from the ERRF. State On-Scene Coordinator's (SOSCs) personnel costs are paid from the General Fund and are not cost recoverable. Moneys expended from the ERRF for private emergency responder contractor services are cost recoverable.

Penalties: Penalties are assessable to a Responsible Party for failure to report a release of a

hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant, or for failure to comply with a departmental or judicial cleanup order.

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HEER Office Emergency Preparedness and Response Key Actions

The Emergency Preparedness and Response (EP&R) Section of the HEER Office is the State's lead on environmental emergencies, responding to releases or threats of releases of hazardous substances which include oil and/or chemicals on land or in water. The EP&R Section includes highly trained State On- Scene Coordinators (SOSCs) who provide 24/7 response capabilities and are authorized to take emergency actions needed to protect public health and the environment.

On October 10, 2024, American Marine reported a release of 5 gallons of red-dye diesel into Honolulu Harbor, Pier 13, as they were transferring fuel to a tugboat. On the following day, the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office (HEER) received a report from the Hawaii State Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR), Division of Aquatic Resources (DAR), that an employee had gone home sick after noticing strong fuel odors and a red sheen along the shoreline of their Sand Island facility. HEER responded to the scene to conduct a shoreline assessment and coordinated with American Marine to clean nearly 500 feet of rocky shoreline, thereby mitigating further volatile organic compound exposures and minimizing any impacts to the saltwater intake that feeds into the State's coral nursery

Airplane Crashed into an Abandoned Building

On December 17, 2024, a small propeller plane crashed into an abandoned building shortly after takeoff. While most of the fuel from the plane was consumed in the fire after the crash, some fuel spread into the surrounding area. HEER OSCs went to the scene and took samples from the site. Fuel contamination was discovered at the property and in a nearby canal where runoff from the incident flowed and parts of the plane landed. Working with the Hawaii State Department of Transportation (DOT), who are the property owners of the building and the canal, the fuel impacted soil was removed and site was cleaned.

Nissan Leaf Electric Vehicle Lithium-ion Battery involved fire at Tony Hyundai Waipio's charging station

On March 1, 2025, a 2020 Nissan EV Leaf caught fire while plugged into the charging station behind Tony Hyundai Waipio. The building was evacuated, and the Honolulu Fire Department spent almost 2 hours and used approximately 18,000 gallons to extinguish the EV fire. Two State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs) coordinated with the Nissan Leaf EV owner, their insurance company, Tony Hyundai Waipio management, HFD, and the tow company to remove the electric vehicle. The Nissan Leaf currently remains at the salvage yard awaiting Nissan's inspection due to the issued recall.

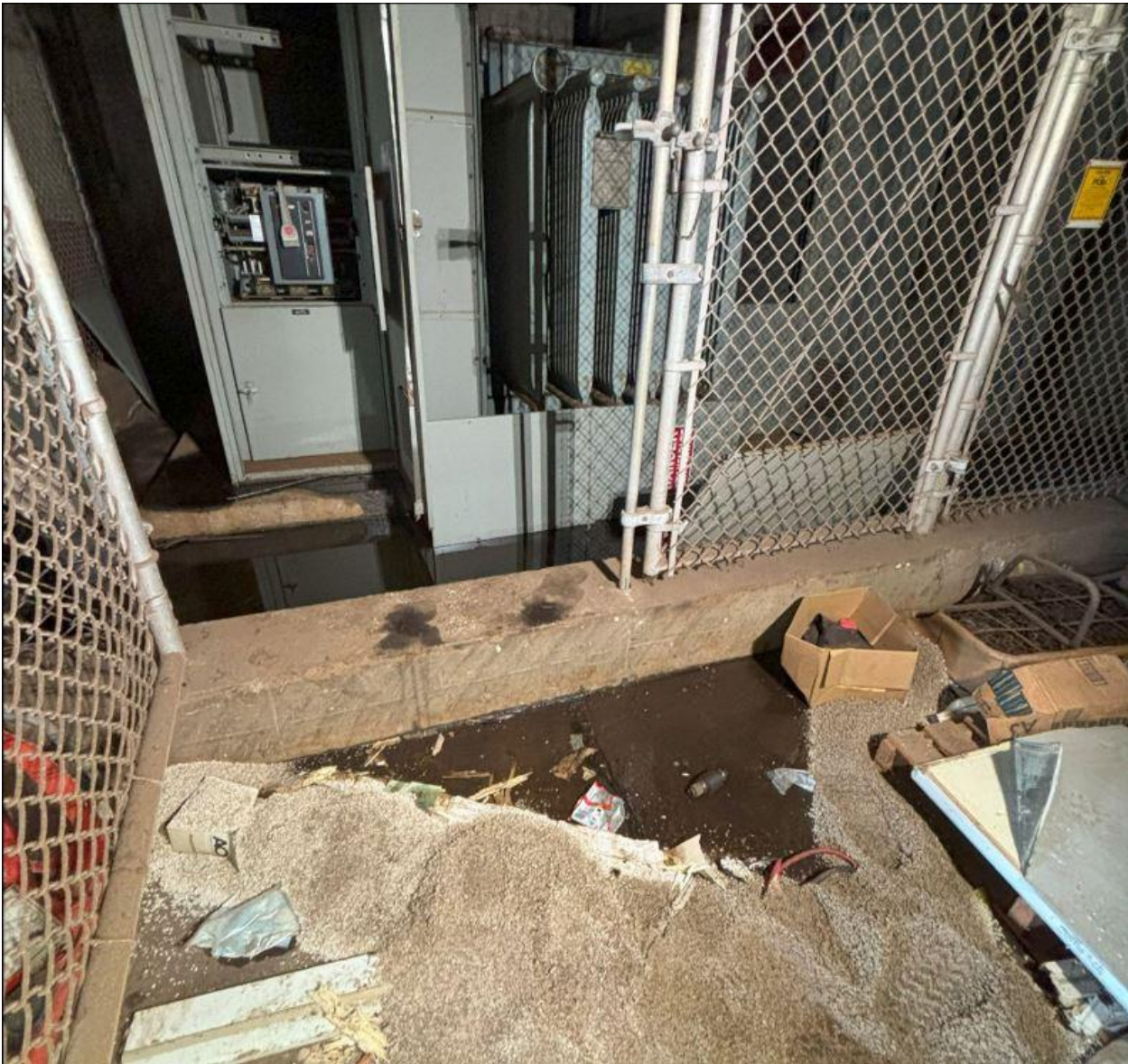
Mercury Spill in Bishop Museum Lab

On April 25, 2025, a mercury thermometer was dropped and released its contents in a lab area of Bishop Museum. HEER OSCs went to the scene using mercury vapor analyzers to assess the site. Elevated levels of mercury vapor were discovered along with visible beads of mercury in the immediate area. The area of the lab was sectioned off until an environmental consulting company could remove the contamination.

Waipahu Incinerator PCB Transformer Spill

The City and County of Honolulu's contractors were conducting a permitted demolition of the Waipahu Incinerator Building when they discovered a transformer that was leaking polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) oil from a disconnected cable line. HEER SOSCs responded to the site on May 23, 2025, and confirmed the presence of PCBs using a field test kit. HEER has since provided oversight and guidance on the safe removal of 270 gallons of PCB-containing oil from the transformer, cleaning of impacted surfaces, and the proper containment and disposal of the hazardous waste.



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Hazard Evaluation Actions and Studies

Health Impacts of the November 2021 Petroleum Contamination of the Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam Water System

Working to Understand the Human Health Impacts of JP-5 Jet Fuel Contamination on People Served by the Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam Water System

The November 2021 release of jet fuel from the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and the subsequent contamination of the drinking water system was a massive environmental catastrophe that sickened thousands of people. The event was unprecedented, with no historical or experimental models available that predict health effects from drinking water contaminated with JP-5 jet fuel. Given the lack of available information, it became necessary to further investigate possible health impacts, as well as provide health information and guidance to the public, health care providers, and the community. HEER staff worked extensively on this aspect of the emergency response to this contamination event spearheading efforts that included:

- Partnering with CDC's Agency for Toxic Substance and Disease Registry (ATSDR) to perform 2 Assessment of Chemical Exposure (ACE) Health Impact Surveys to evaluate the experiences of people exposed to the contaminated water.
 - The first ACE survey was conducted in January and February 2022 and had 2289 participants. 87% of participants reported health symptoms from the incident with 80% of those having improvement when they switched to an alternative water source. The survey demonstrated people were having significant health symptoms as well as significant life disruptions from the event and mistrust of responding agencies.  - The Follow-up Ace survey was conducted in September 2022 and was designed to evaluate ongoing health symptoms and people's attitudes towards their drinking

water. The follow-up survey had 986 participants. Of the respondents, 80% reported on going health symptoms with 65% of those expressing high or very high confidence that their symptoms were related to the contaminated water incident. Participants also expressed significant mental health impacts from the event and concern and frustration with communication, transparency and trust. Analysis is complete and a manuscript is being prepared for peer-review and publication

- Extensive research and risk assessment work to develop an Environmental Action Level (EAL) for the release of fresh JP-5 jet fuel in drinking water. This effort, led by HEER staff, required complex risk assessment work and calculations to account for the specific chemical properties of JP-5 and the freshness of the fuel. Risk Assessments of this type generally take months to years to complete but was accomplished by the HEER Office in a few weeks due to the emergency nature of the problem. - Continued efforts to urge the Department of Defense, the Defense Health Agency and the US Navy to apply their extensive resources to further caring for people affected by the water contamination. With its partners at CDC/ATSDR, HEER has been instrumental in convincing the Department of Defense and Defense Health Agency to establish a Red Hill Water Clinic to centralize evaluation and treatment of on-going health concerns. In addition, HEER and CDC/ATSDR staff continue to urge DOD and DHA to establish a third-party health registry that would follow exposed persons for years to evaluate health impacts.

Red Hill Tank Clean Up and Closure

The toxicologists at the HEER Office have been involved in supporting the closing efforts for the Red Hill fuel tank facility. HEER office has been involved in the risk assessment/characterization and other technical support to the Solid Hazard Waste Branch along with the EPA, for this endeavor.

Evaluating Infrastructure and Health Risks of Lead in Drinking Water at Hawaii Schools and Child Care Facilities

Hawaii Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Section 2107 Drinking Water Project

WIIN 2107 is a federal grant for testing drinking water for lead contamination at schools and childcare centers. Working in close collaboration with DOH's Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), State Laboratories Division (SLD), and Children with Special Health Needs Branch (CSHNB), plus the Hawaii Department of Education (DOE), and the Hawaii Department of Human Services (DHS), HEER completed Stage 1 of this extensive project in 2021, testing for lead in drinking water from 6,210 taps at 106 elementary schools and 117 child care facilities.

Stage 2 of the WIIN project, which included testing 4,459 samples at the remaining 72 DOE elementary schools completed in October 2022. Overall project results found elevated levels of lead in the drinking water at 3.7% of the elementary school taps and 1.6% of the childcare taps. In total, 133 elementary schools and 4 childcare facilities had at least one tap above the project action level for lead of 15 parts per billion (ppb). HEER created and helped distribute educational and communication materials for the staff, students, and families at the schools and childcare centers as well as a public website (<https://health.hawaii.gov/WIIN>) that displayed results in near real time and provides information on the project and resources for reducing lead exposure from drinking water. HEER continues to work with DOE and DHS to prevent exposure from lead in the drinking water at their facilities and develop long-term solutions to these infrastructure problems in an effort to maintain a safe and healthy environment for kids to learn and grow. In October 2022, HEER staff, in partnership with DOH's SDWB and Hawaii DOE were awarded a \$2 million competitive grant from EPA to replace problematic drinking water fixtures at schools. This grant award will close the circle of this important project that investigated and identified lead hazards in

drinking water at schools and will now repair the infrastructure to fix this problem.

Work on the fixture replacement (Stage 3) and verification testing commenced in early 2023. So far, all 1459 fixtures that were identified as lead hazards have been replaced. All the replaced fixtures have undergone verification testing and 1159 have been released for unrestricted use. In June 2023, HEER staff, in partnership with DOE began working with informatics and software development firm Axiom Data Science to create a fixture replacement website where the public can track the progress and status of replacements. The fixture replacement website development is live and linked from HEER's already existing WIIN website.

There are 151 middle schools and 66 high schools in the state of Hawaii with total count of 75,998 students. As children make the natural progression through grade school there is a risk of cumulative exposure in middle school and high school.

Stage 4 is an ongoing follow up study is fully funded through the DOE, using the same screening methods were used to identify middle school and high schools (7-12) water sources that exceed the new EPA lead trigger levels of 15 part per billion (ppb). Testing took place from October 2025 – November 2025 with all data made available on the HEER Office website live starting November 5th, 2025. Differing from previous years, Phase 4 data is hosted on Google Sheets versus Airtable on the HEER Office website.

Adult Blood Lead Epidemiology & Surveillance (ABLES) Program

The ABLES program is a state-based surveillance program of laboratory-reported adult blood lead levels. The program objective is to build state capacity to initiate, expand, or improve adult blood lead surveillance programs which can accurately measure trends in adult blood lead levels, and which can effectively intervene to prevent lead over-exposures.

Elevated Blood Lead Levels charts are based on data from the NIOSH Adult Blood Lead Epidemiology Surveillance (ABLES) program, a state-based surveillance program of laboratory-reported adult blood lead levels (BLLs). These charts summarize cases of elevated BLLs (BLL=10 µg/dL and BLL=25 µg/dL) among employed adults (ages 16 years and up). In light of the new presidential administration, NIOSH of the CDC has experience numerous funding

and staffing shortages. As a result, FY2024 and expected 2025 data has been collected and validated by HEER Office personnel via MAVEN data. Number of Cases for Elevated Blood Lead Levels from years 2002 – 2025 are available now on the HEER website.

The Hawaii Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (HI-CLPPP)

In October 2017, CDC funding revitalized the Hawaii Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (HI-CLPPP) as a joint program of the HEER office and the Children with Special Health Needs Branch (CSHNB). In FY2022, this funding was renewed for an additional 5 years. HEER provides medical direction and technical assistance from the HEER Toxicologist. Together, the HI-CLPPP team is working to reduce children's exposure to lead by primary prevention outreach and education, improving blood lead level surveillance, advocating for increased blood lead testing, case management, guidelines for health care professionals, lead poisoning education, and linking families to needed services.

It remains an on-going concern for HI-CLPPP that less than 30% of Hawaii's keiki are tested for lead. This low testing rate combined with lead poisoning's initially silent nature ensures that many children with lead poisoning are unrecognized and not receiving the services they require to minimize the devastating neurodevelopmental effects of lead poisoning. HI-CLPPP continues to work to raise awareness about childhood lead poisoning and to work with providers and families to increase blood lead testing rates.

Support Hosting the Lahaina Post-Fire Soil Results

The USACE, collected Lahaina soil samples in accordance with the HEER Office's TGMs, and the test results were made available to the public on the Environmental Monitoring Maui Wildfire Data Portal: <https://health.hawaii.gov/environmental-data/>. The HEER Office provided technical support in this hosting the soil data, and provided user instruction to navigate this portal, to the Lahaina community through in-person training during the September 3rd community meeting.

Ecological and Human Health Risk Key Studies

The HEER Office Hazard Evaluation (HE) Section provides ecological and human health risk assessment, conducts toxicological assessments of chemical threats to human health, establishes appropriate cleanup levels for chemical contamination, and assists the public with information concerning the health effects of chemicals.

Evaluating Perfluoroalkyl Substance (PFAS) Contamination in Hawaii and Potential Risks to Human Health and the Environment

PFASs are a large class of chemicals used in many materials for their waterproofing qualities. Traditional sources of PFAS include aqueous firefighting foam (AFFF) used frequently at airports and military bases, waterproof and stain resistant consumer goods, food packaging, and a variety of industrial processes. Because of their many uses and their persistence in the environment, PFASs are known to accumulate in treated wastewater, biosolids from wastewater treatment and at landfills. Currently, little is known about the burden of PFAS contamination in Hawaii. In FY2024, HEER worked on multiple projects to help further assess the burden of PFAS contamination in Hawaii and its potential risks to Human Health the environment. Current projects include:

- Evaluating PFAS contamination in treated wastewater and biosolids, landfill leachate, and soils where treated wastewater is reused. This project was funded by the EPA in FY2020 and is designed to better understand the degrees of PFAS contamination in treated wastewater that is reused or discharged to the ocean as well as in biosolids and landfill leachate. Samples for this project have been collected from Hazard Evaluation Actions and Studies ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE AND PLANNING COMMUNITY KNOWLEDGE REPORT TO THE THIRTY-THIRD LEGISLATURE, STATE OF HAWAII 2025 Section 3, Page 4 wastewater treatment plants and landfills from Kauai, Maui and Hawaii Counties with plans for the collection of samples from Honolulu County wastewater treatment plants and landfills as well as from Army and Navy locations on Oahu. Results from this project will help HEER better understand how

these chemicals are moving through the environment and evaluate potential human exposures to PFASs and begin to develop ways to limit these chemicals in the environment. A technical report summarizing the results of the study was posted to the HEER Office EHE-EAL webpage (<https://health.hawaii.gov/heer/environmental-health/highlighted-projects/pfas/>). A recorded presentation on the results of the study is posted to the HEER Office Webinar webpage (<https://health.hawaii.gov/heer/guidance/heer-webinars/>). Additionally, the manuscript of this work is under preparation.

- HEER staff led by Dr. Roger Brewer, utilized the latest scientific information to develop Environmental Action Levels (EALs) for 26 PFASs in soil and groundwater. The EALs have undergone extensive public review and final interim EALS were published in December 2020 with the latest update in April 2025. Dr Brewer was invited to give presentations on the Hawaii guidance at several national and international conferences. These EALs are the most comprehensive set of risk-based, soil and groundwater action levels for PFASs in the US and continue to be reevaluated by HEER staff.

Environmental Action Levels (EALs) for Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFASs) Key updates include the addition of perfluoroethanoate (PFEtA-, also known as trifluoroacetate); revision of sorption coefficients and solubility data using the USEPA CompTox database (reflected in Table 2 and updated figures, affecting soil leaching action levels); a minor modification to the method for calculating excess organic fluorine with negligible impact on Total PFAS Risk; inclusion of a new option in the Total PFAS Risk calculator to account for the cumulative toxicity of “Excess Fluorine PFASs,” contingent on supporting technical data; and correction of soil direct-exposure action levels for HFPO-DA.

- HEER Office is evaluating the potential uptake of PFASs in food crops from compost prepared with PFAS-containing compostable food ware and irrigation through R1 water (recycled-disinfected water). The project will also investigate the potential uptake of PFASs into food crops from agricultural fields irrigated with municipal wastewater. All contractors and required permits are almost set in place and the

project is scheduled to start in early 2026 and be completed by the end of that year.

- Since October 2024, the HEER has been leading the state’s PFAS-taskforce, to discuss and plan the state’s direction for tackling PFAS-related issues. The taskforce includes all branches within DOH that has concern regarding PFAS. The task force has been meeting quarterly.

Evaluating the Risks of Climate Change on Sites with Chemical Contamination

The HEER Office continues its work evaluating the risks of climate change on sites with known chemical contamination in Hawaii. Hawaii has around 1,000 sites with known chemical contamination that are monitored and regulated by the Department of Health’s Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office. Many of the contaminated sites are in low lying areas and along shorelines and are at risk for coastal erosion, as well as submersion and impacts from flooding, groundwater inundation and sea level rise.

While hazards from contamination may be mitigated by removal, treatment or destruction of contaminated media, the most commonly used remedial option across the islands is to prevent exposure by managing contaminated materials in place. This is often done through a combination of physical containment, including protective caps or treatment, and institutional controls such as guidance or restrictions against reuse of sites for residential housing, playgrounds and schools. However, the use of these strategies has historically been viewed in the context of a static environment. The increasing impacts from climate change and sea level rise including more frequent flooding, accelerated erosion and related disruption of contaminated lands due to sea level rise, ground water inundation and an increase in storms and heavy rain events require an equal progression in the manner in which risk is evaluated and mitigated for these types of sites. Of particular concern are large, current or former industrial sites in coastal areas that are known to be heavily contaminated and are at high risk of climate change-related impacts. This includes many harbors, airports, bulk fuel terminals, and former landfills in the islands.

Specific concerns related to these contaminated areas result from the chemical changes induced by sea level rise, effects of barometric pressure changes and increased precipitation (e.g., storms),

groundwater inundation and increased flooding. Risks to human health and the environment can increase significantly when these contaminants are moved from their current location to areas that did not previously contain contamination. This includes the possible release of contaminants into drinking water sources and the food chain via fish and shellfish. The HEER office published a memo outlining these hazards and specific risks in Hawaii in June 2021. The memo can be viewed on <https://health.hawaii.gov/heer/climate-and-health/>. Public comments on the memo are also posted to the website. HEER plans to expand work in this area by defining guidance for environmental clean-ups in climate change impacted areas and continuing research and modeling into the potential hazards.

As part of HEER's expanding climate and health portfolio, the Epidemiologist is conducting a comprehensive heat-related illness (HRI) study. Using ESSENCE syndromic surveillance data, temperature and humidity indices, geographic vulnerability layers, and demographic data, the study evaluates patterns of HRI across the state, characterizes the relationship between extreme heat and health outcomes, and identifies populations at elevated risk. Syndromic signals are triangulated with Poison Control calls (e.g., heat-associated dehydration, chemical exposures exacerbated by heat events) and relevant environmental datasets to improve interpretation and situational awareness. This work will inform climate adaptation planning, heat-health early warning systems, and statewide prevention strategies aimed at reducing morbidity associated with extreme heat.

Development of a Hazardous Chemical Facility Risk Index

To support proactive planning and prioritize risk reduction, HEER is developing a hazardous chemical facility risk index. This index incorporates site chemical inventories, spill history, proximity to sensitive populations, health indicators, and climate vulnerability factors such as flood zones, sea level rise exposure areas, and groundwater inundation models. The Epidemiologist integrates surveillance data—including Maven laboratory findings, ESSENCE syndromic trends, and Poison Control exposure reports—to inform the health-risk dimension of this index. The resulting tool will support HEER's statewide prioritization of high-risk facilities, guide emergency preparedness, and enhance decision-making regarding inspections, monitoring, and resource allocation.

Assessing the Chemistry and Toxicity of Groundwater Contaminated with Petroleum Fuels

The HEER Office completed a study of the chemistry and toxicity of drinking water contaminated with petroleum fuels. The results of the study were used to update HDOH action levels. The updates allowed for a more in-depth assessment of the health risk posed by petroleum-contaminated groundwater in Hawai'i, including impacts to groundwater beneath the Navy's Red Hill Tank Farm complex. The study, the most detailed of its kind carried out in the US, was overseen by Dr. Roger Brewer and funded through grants to the HEER Office from the USEPA. Groundwater Basics Webinar

From May to June 2025, a four-part "Groundwater Basics" was created by experts from DOH's Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office, Safe Drinking Water Branch, and Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch. This webinar covers for session: 1. What an aquifer is and its importance; 2. How groundwater flows through rock formations; 3. How contaminants travel underground; and 4. Cleanup strategies for polluted plumes. The recordings and slides are available on the HEER webinar page.

Health Surveillance for Environmental Factors

In FY2024, staff provided risk assessment support and responded to a wide range of inquiries concerning potential health hazards. These inquiries included questions related to heavy metals (mercury, lead, and arsenic), pesticides, indoor and outdoor air pollutants, drinking water contamination, and illnesses potentially associated with environmental exposures. Inquiries originate from the public, media, healthcare providers, and partner agencies, and are recorded in the Inquiry module of iHEER.

To support these assessments, HEER integrates information from multiple surveillance systems, including Maven (laboratory-based reporting for heavy metals and pesticide biomarkers), ESSENCE syndromic surveillance (monitoring ED/UC visits for chemical inhalation, respiratory symptoms, heat-

related illness, and other environmentally linked conditions), and Poison Control data (real-time reports of chemical, metal, and pesticide exposures). By triangulating data across these systems, HEER is able to validate concerns, detect potential exposure events, assess emerging patterns, and provide more accurate and timely guidance to the public and medical community.

Health Advisories for Kilauea Eruptions and Evaluating Public Health Effects from the 2018 Kilauea East Rift Zone Eruption

HEER continues to provide technical support and public outreach regarding volcanic emissions and resulting air quality hazards. HEER staff actively participates in the Inter-Agency Vog Network and collaborates with other DOH branches to issue health advisories on protecting oneself from hazards related to volcanic gases and vog. In addition, HEER utilizes **syndromic surveillance monitoring** through the ESSENCE system to track emergency department and urgent care visits for respiratory symptoms, asthma exacerbations, and other health outcomes associated with vog exposure. This real-time monitoring strengthens HEER's situational awareness during volcanic activity, validates community health concerns, and supports rapid dissemination of public health guidance.

Environmentally Related Illness and Injury Reporting and Surveillance (Pesticides and Heavy Metals)

Under the authority of Section 321-311, HRS, Environmentally Related Illness and Injury Surveillance, the HEER Office is required to collect information on Pesticide and Heavy Metal Poisoning. Maven, the electronic surveillance database, receives these results automatically using electronic laboratory reporting (ELR). Using the lab results in Maven, HEER is able to track children and adults with elevated levels of heavy metals including lead, arsenic, cadmium, mercury, and zinc, as well as abnormal markers of pesticide exposure. Tracking these cases allows HEER to analyze the data for geographic and demographic trends and provide individual case management support to doctors and families. HEER staff continues to work with Information Technology Specialists in other sections of DOH to maximize the functionality and efficiency of the Maven system.

In addition to Maven, HEER incorporates **syndromic surveillance monitoring** to strengthen environmental health surveillance statewide. Using emergency department and urgent care data from the ESSENCE system, HEER monitors trends in

symptoms and ICD-10 codes potentially related to environmental exposures, including chemical inhalation, pesticide-related illness, heat-related illness, and other acute environmental hazards. Syndromic data allow HEER to detect unusual patterns, validate community concerns, and enhance situational awareness when laboratory confirmation may not be immediately available.

Collaborations on Public Health Education and Outreach

Hawaii Poison Center (HPC)

The HPC operates a 24/7 hotline to assist residents and health care providers. DOH receives data from the HPC on the number and types of acute pesticide poisonings. The HPC is mandated by legislation and is under the auspices of the Hawaii State Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention System Branch. Annually, the center receives over 9,000 information and poisoning exposure calls from residents and health care providers throughout the state. Services are provided free of charge every day of the year, 24 hours a day by registered nurse specialists, pharmacists, and physicians specially trained in medical toxicology. The center is operated by the Rocky Mountain Poison Center, Denver, Colorado, an accredited regional poison center by the American Association of Poison Control Centers (AAPCC). The HPC provides 24/7 medical advice for management of suspected pesticide exposures and informs DOH on behalf of the providers. This system provides an enhanced and streamlined communication option for the providers. The HEER Toxicologist continues to work with the HPC on industrial, occupational, and environmental poisonings providing local technical support and collaboration.

HEER-Center for Marine Debris Research Collaborative Project

HEER continues to support the Center for Marine Debris Research by providing X-ray fluorescence (XRF) scanning to assess the heavy metal content of marine debris and microplastics collected across Hawai'i. These analyses help identify contaminants such as lead, cadmium, chromium, and other hazardous metals that can accumulate on or within plastic fragments as they weather in the marine environment. By evaluating both larger debris items and microplastic particles, HEER's technical support strengthens statewide efforts to characterize pollutant burdens, understand pathways of environmental contamination, and assess potential risks to ecosystems and human health. This collaboration

enhances research on the chemical hazards associated with marine debris and supports the development of strategies to reduce pollutant exposure in Hawai'i's coastal areas.

HEER-HPC Collaborative Project

The toxicologist at the HEER Office identified a gene variation (MTHFR gene) which can make individuals with this mutation more sensitive to the toxic effects of mercury and some other heavy metals. This association between MTHFR deficiency and mercury was recognized during two inquiries (one from the public and the other from a clinic). Although such association is somewhat known, it is not well established. This is particularly relevant to Hawaii since the Hawaiian diet heavily involve fish intake, which is a major contributor of mercury. The HEER office and the HPC is collaborating on writing a manuscript for scientific publication with the intent to bring more attention to this issue, and perhaps, include this gene deficiency as a consideration in mercury poisoning cases.

HEER Guidance and Training

Technical Guidance Manual (TGM)

The HEER office updated the primary guidance used to assess health and environmental risk posed by contamination of soil, air and water. The document includes "Environmental Action Levels" (EALs) for over 200 chemicals commonly found at contaminated industrial, residential and agricultural properties. Additional investigation is normally required when concentration of a chemical in soil, water or air exceeds the EAL. Areas of the TGM updated in 2021 include the sections on Decision Unit characterization

for sampling and methods for sampling groundwater and surface water. In addition, the entire TGM was moved from an external server managed by a consultant to HEER's internal server, allowing for greater control and more frequent updating of the guidance. Chapters 3, 4 and 5 were updated and consolidated into two titled SECTION 3 SITE INVESTIGATION DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION: OVERVIEW and SECTION 4 SITE INVESTIGATION DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION: APPENDICES.

Hazard Evaluation Section Personnel Change

Jared Wagner has taken the position as Epidemiologist II from June 2024. The Epidemiologist now leads and conducts environmental epidemiological investigations to identify, characterize, and respond to environmental health concerns across the state. In June 2024, Daniel Nguyen, a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Career Epidemiology Field Officer and US Public Health Service Scientist Officer, was assigned to the DOH Environmental Health Administration and sits with the HEER Office to strengthen epidemiological capacity for public health preparedness and response in the State of Hawai'i. In October 2024, John Jacob joined the HEER Office as the new State Toxicologist. Roger Brewer retired from his position as Environmental Toxicologist in November 2024 after dedicated service to the State of Hawai'i. In April 2025, Weila Li assumed the role of Environmental Toxicologist, continuing the work of supporting the HEER Office's environmental and toxicological assessment programs.

Site Discovery, Assessment and Remediation Cleanup Highlights

Continued Redevelopment of Contaminated Properties

For FY 2025, the HEER Office's Site Discovery and Remediation (SDAR) section performed its primary mission of discovery and oversight of assessment and cleanup activities for sites across the state including privately owned, municipal, and state-owned properties, as well as federal military sites. New project managers have been trained and mentored to address the various site work required.

Sites Evaluated for Removal and Remedial Actions

Property owners, responsible parties, and prospective purchasers contact the HEER Office to report releases of hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) 128D and to assess and manage hazardous substances, pollutants or contamination affecting properties in which they have an interest in.

Our general state and federally funded remediation project managers (RPMs) evaluate information provided, review determinations of the nature and extent of contamination and, if necessary, require removal or remedial actions to be taken to protect human health and the environment.

To date, 1,965 state sites have been identified and managed by the Site Discovery, Assessment, and Remediation (SDAR) Section along with 87 consultations, 18 administrative sites to track multiple interests, and 25 Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA)-lead sites. Of these, 777 sites have received No Further Action (NFA) determinations which included 283 sites that received an NFA with Institutional Controls (NFAIC) letters which require long-term management and land use restrictions to protect human health and the environment and 372 sites that received unrestricted NFA letters which have no ongoing oversight requirements. The remaining NFA determinations were documented on initial site-screening sheets and other documents but do not have a recorded NFA letter.

During FY 2025, 33 new state sites were added and 12 sites received NFA letters, with six of those sites requiring ongoing institutional controls to manage residual risks. A thirteenth site was closed out with a No Action status. At the end of FY 2025, 1,121 state

sites remained open under active oversight and are being remediated or assessed for future action.

In addition to overseeing state sites, SDAR provides regulatory oversight of hazardous substance response actions for the Department of Defense (DoD) service branches under federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) authorities and HRS 128D. Sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance (UXO) and chemically contaminated sites. Petroleum-contaminated military sites are exempt under CERCLA, as well as military operations including tank farms, pipelines, industrial activities, and active training sites. A DoD cooperative agreement funds the DOH oversight of most military sites under EPA CERCLA authority. Investigation and cleanup of petroleum-contaminated military sites, which are exempt under CERCLA, are conducted under HRS 128D authority. Cleanup and DOH oversight for petroleum-related activities are also covered under the cooperative funding agreements.

To date, 1,133 military sites have been identified and managed by the SDAR section under the Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program. Of these, 546 sites received NFA determinations which included 398 with Institutional Controls in place to protect human health and the environment and 147 sites with NFAs requiring no ongoing oversight.

During FY 2025, four new sites were added to the DSMOA program. Overall, 546 military sites remain open at the end of FY 2025 under active oversight and are being remediated or assessed for future action.

Responsible Party Cooperation

The Hawaii Environmental Response Law, HRS 128D, allows responsible parties and property owners to investigate and clean up contamination under the regulatory oversight of the HEER Office. The HEER Office has the authority to issue orders to require investigation and cleanup of properties that pose an imminent threat to human health or the environment. In instances where there is no responsible party or the responsible party fails to take action, the Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) may be expended to complete cleanup activities to protect human health and the environment.

The HEER Office aims to collaborate with responsible parties and property owners in identifying potential hazards and directing potential investigations and cleanup activities. This partnership approach results in more successful and timely cleanups while conserving fund monies.

During FY 2025, a limited number of cleanup actions were conducted under one of three types of regulatory agreements with the HEER Office, described below.

Voluntary Response Program Key Oversight

The Voluntary Response Program (VRP) encourages voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties and includes a cost recovery mechanism to offset HEER oversight costs. Under HRS 128D, DOH has the authority to grant prospective purchasers or developers an exemption from future liability if cleanup is performed to DOH specifications under the program.

Past, current or future property owners can participate in this program, but exemptions from liability can only be given to future purchasers and tenants. Completion of the voluntary cleanup action is accompanied by a Letter of Completion (LOC) issued by DOH and noted on the property deed. In 2019, the City and County of Honolulu entered into the VRP for the Iwilei Center. In September 2024, the City and County of Honolulu agreed on the language of the LOC and DOH issued the LOC for Iwilei Center VRP Site 34. A final environmental covenant was signed by both parties in June 2025. Iwilei Center is planned to be a cornerstone of the City and County of Honolulu's planned transit-oriented development of a large area of the Iwilei District of Honolulu. To date, 36 contaminated properties have been enrolled in the VRP program and 20 have completed the process.

In FY 2025, site characterization work began on the Waialua Settling Ponds VRP Site 28. Additional characterization of the site is currently ongoing.

Responsible parties with sites participating in the VRP pay the state for DOH oversight of their remedial activities. Sites that have received LOCs where residual contamination is left in place require on-going management. Redevelopment of these sites requires additional coordination and oversight by the HEER Office to ensure compliance with LOC restrictions.

Fast Track Program

The HEER Office Fast Track Cleanup (FTC) process provides a streamlined approach for property owners to conduct protective, independent cleanups of low and medium priority sites, and improve Hawaii's ability to focus on more serious and complex releases. The program provides expedited oversight initiated with a standardized application for sites with low environmental risks. Forms and information on FTC designed to enable landowners or other private parties to conduct a voluntary investigation or cleanup under an agreement with the HEER Office are located at:

There are no properties currently in the Fast Track Program.

Preliminary Assessment and Site Inspection Program

Discovery of historically contaminated sites that may pose a threat to current or future users is an important focus area for the HEER Office. The HEER Office uses federal Preliminary Assessment and Site Inspection Grant funding to identify historical sources of contamination and potential releases of hazardous substances to soil and surface water. These sites may be sampled to determine if contamination is present that could cause harm to public health and the environment, especially when sites are redeveloped to residential use or if contaminated soils are excavated and re-used where children and other sensitive receptors could be inadvertently exposed. The HEER Office was awarded a grant of \$245,000 for 2025 by the EPA and conducts and submits eight site screens per fiscal year for EPA's review.

Scope and Data Collection Approaches

Sites are identified by searching historical digital collections that include the Hawaii State Archives, the Hawaii State Public Library System's Hawaii and Pacific Collection, the University of Hawaii at Manoa Library Maps, Aerial Photographs, Hawaii Aviation and GIS website, and national resources including the Library of Congress Sanborn Map Collection and the Chronicling America digital collection of Hawaii newspapers. These resources, plus locally administered plantation museums in each county provide maps, aerial photos, and oral histories to assist in locating areas formerly used to store, mix, and load pesticides for distribution on sugarcane, pineapple, and other agricultural industries. The historical application of pesticides for termite control,

banned in 1988, are exposed in soils under structures subject to demolition and grading prior to reuse of the site. Emerging contaminants such as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in fire-fighting foam used at fire-fighting training areas is also a focus of the assessments.

Hawaii's Unique Challenges

As a small, isolated state in the middle of the Pacific, Hawaii faces unique challenges cleaning up contaminated properties. On the Continental U.S., a common cleanup solution is often removal and disposal of contaminated materials to a nearby waste facility, or onsite treatment of contamination to reduce or remove hazards.

Unfortunately, limited available land for dedicated disposal facilities and the economics of transporting remedial equipment and waste across the Pacific constrain feasibility of both disposal and treatment options. As a result, Hawaii has relied on risk-based closures and on-site management of contamination for many sites as these are frequently much more feasible alternatives to implement. However, especially in the face of rapid land use changes and redevelopment, Hawaii is facing the challenge of how to effectively manage contamination in the long-term, how to keep the engineering and institutional controls in place over long periods and changing uses, and how to control soil export from those sites. In addition to limited available land, future sea level rise has the potential to reduce the effectiveness of engineering and institutional controls and mobilize previously contained environmental hazards in low-lying coastal regions.

In FY 2025, the HEER Office began work to identify sites where contamination is currently managed in place so that these remedies can be re-evaluated to determine whether additional controls or other response actions are warranted to ensure the protectiveness of the selected remedies. The HEER Office has also begun requiring the recording of environmental covenants in accordance with HRS 508C on the property deeds of sites closed with long-term management requirements. It is anticipated that the environmental covenants will help ensure that required site controls are managed in the future. The environmental covenants should also provide the HEER Office greater authority to require compliance with agreed upon long-term management measures.

Refining the Proactive Approach to Contamination State-wide

One of the biggest challenges we face in the HEER Office is that many of the significant releases that are reported which require further investigation and remediation are the result of historic industrial and fuel handling activities, and tend to occur most frequently in industrial areas, harbors, airports, pipeline corridors, and historic chemical use and storage facilities. Managing these sites individually as releases are reported means that the HEER Office often finds out after a problem or release has occurred. For example, a previously unidentified leaking underground storage tank (LUST) may be encountered during excavation for development of a new apartment building at the location of a former dry-cleaning facility. In this instance, construction work must be halted while the HEER Office investigates and then works with the property owner to characterize the nature and extent of the contamination, evaluate the hazards, and determine an appropriate clean-up plan in accordance with state regulations. In addition to potential exposure of workers and the public to environmental hazards associated with the release, construction delays can be a significant concern to the property owner and developer.

In response to these issues, the HEER Office has begun to adopt a broad, proactive strategy to address the discovery, interim management, and remediation of sites statewide. The strategy consists of three components:

1. Programmatic/Areawide Environmental Hazard Management Plans (EHMPs)
2. Extensive Public Outreach and Material Development
3. Site and Document tracking available to the public via iHEER

The combination of these three components helps the HEER Office to address potential environmental hazards at sites before they become issues by providing the public at-large with as much information and guidance as possible about potential hazards before contamination is encountered. Our priority is to provide publicly available information about local and areawide contamination concerns that property owners, tenants, developers and prospective purchasers can use to keep their tenants, contractors, and the public safe from contamination exposures on their properties.

Notification and tracking allow the HEER Office to flag sites with known historic contamination entering the redevelopment process before construction starts. This enables early intervention by the HEER Office during the planning process of development rather than having to stop construction that can lead to costly delays. It also prevents unintended exposure of construction workers and the general public should contamination from historic releases be encountered.

In FY 2020, the HEER Office first published the Site-Specific and Construction EHMP (C-EHMP) templates. The templates reduce time and costs in preparation of documents and provide more effective protection of human health and the environment by adding minimum handling standards and tracking of companies involved in the project. The C-EHMP template has streamlined information gathering about proposed development and redevelopment projects and distills contaminant management to essentials, while prescribing expected minimum hazard management procedures. Additionally, the use of Site-Specific EHMP and C-EHMP templates has allowed for more consistent implementation of site controls and faster document review. This enables the HEER Office to better maintain its services to the public.

In FY 2025, the HEER Office updated the descriptions of the types of EHMPs in its Technical Guidance Manual (TGM) and added a requirement for sites that are closed with residual contamination left in-place to record an environmental covenant in accordance with 508C HRS on the property title referencing the site restrictions and the Site-Specific Long-term EHMP. The environmental covenant requirement adds another layer of protection for sites that require long-term management of contamination and is consistent with site closure procedures of other state environmental management branches. Following these changes to the TGM, the HEER Office has also begun work on revising the EHMP templates and plans to prepare templates for other documents where practical.

Below are brief descriptions of the three components discussed above.

Programmatic/Areawide Environmental Hazard Management Plans (EHMP)

There are several areas throughout the State that we know have significant contamination being left in place after remedies have been selected and implemented. As the residual contamination may still pose a potential risk to utility and construction

workers performing subsurface maintenance and development activities, guidance has been developed and provided to these entities to protect their workers as they do work in these contaminated areas. This is the primary role of areawide EHMPs and they address areas where 1) the type of contamination is known through several site-specific investigations in the area and 2) the contingency plans for handling the type of contamination in question is well defined. By providing information regarding management of the various media (e.g., soil, groundwater, soil gas) up front, all entities performing intrusive work in the area will be prepared and equipped to manage any hazard they may encounter. This also provides better worker safety and reduces the number of incidents that our emergency responders must address.

This fiscal year, the Department of Transportation Airports Division (DOT-A) recently completed revisions to a Programmatic EHMP for all properties they manage at the request of the HEER Office. The HEER Office plans to work with DOT-A to further revise this document and use it as a model for other agencies to manage large-scale contamination via Programmatic EHMPs.

Public Outreach & Material Development

EHMPs and other types of institutional controls are only as effective as the amount of awareness affected parties have. Public outreach and continuing education to all relevant parties (e.g., utilities, lenders, contractors, State departments, etc.) is required to reinforce what needs to be done and maintain site safety. Meeting with the various stakeholders annually allows the HEER Office to get its safety message out consistently and frequently. HEER Office outreach materials for the various types of contamination (e.g., UXO, arsenic, petroleum) on sites are developed and regularly updated to keep these important messages fresh in the minds of the public.

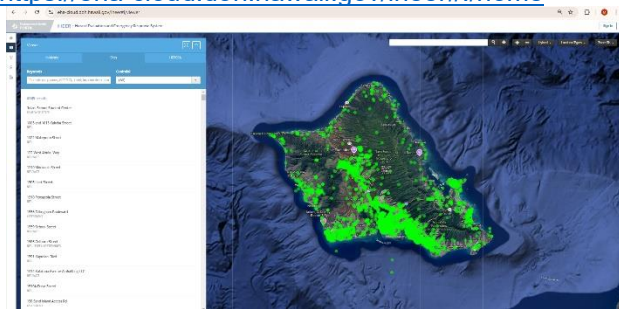
Throughout FY 2025, the HEER Office staff met with numerous site and project stakeholders and participated in several outreach events including providing training to Department of Education personnel and contractors and meetings with the City and County of Honolulu. In FY 2025, the HEER Office also worked to prepare the recently published *HEER Office Clarifications and Responses to Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) for Consultants and Property Owners Fact Sheet* to address many questions posed by environmental consultants, property owners, and developers about

implementation of state environmental regulations and guidance.

Site and Document Tracking by the Public via iHEER & Notification System Use

iHEER is the HEER Office’s site management and document repository system. The public can locate SDAR sites and Emergency Preparedness & Response (EP&R) incidents on a map-based viewer, view site information, and directly download documents. Some restrictions on site viewability and document download apply due to site security concerns or ongoing investigations.

After public record document migration from the previous system, iHEER development focused on the site viewer, grouping, and labeling sites for specific categories. For better site identification, site centroids and site boundaries were separated into different layers. Additional layers were added to track site controls such as site-specific EHMPs, Areawide EHMPs, and temporary Construction EHMPs. For internal management, a layer was added to include site-specific features. Site with controls and sites without controls can also be viewed separately.

iHEER contains 1,027 Brownfield sites that have been tagged and are searchable via a query in the keyword field. Sites affected by an anticipated 3.2 feet of sea-level rises (SLR) and anticipated acute flooding (3.2 feet of SLR plus 1 percent annual chance of flooding) have also been tagged and can be queried.

This fiscal year, SDAR staff continued to update site data for individual sites with the addition of site centroids and property boundaries, EHMP boundaries, and site features. All new incoming documents are processed in iHEER now and are directly accessible thereafter. The immediate access

to all documents by staff is especially advantageous during allowed teleworking. This also allows the public to have access to most draft documents while they are still under review by the site RPM, although it is important for the public to understand that these may differ significantly from the approved final documents.

In FY 2025, the HEER Office also resolved a dispute with the Navy regarding publishing of Navy environmental response documents directly to the public on iHEER due to potential security concerns. As a result, all historical Navy documents in the iHEER database are now directly available to the public. New Navy documents for review are submitted with a redacted version which is made available for public download and review in iHEER.

During FY 2025, the HEER Office developed a standardized process for ranking sites as High, Medium, and Low priorities in accordance with 128D HRS requirements. The HEER Office is currently working with the iHEER developer to incorporate these rankings into iHEER to make them available to the public. Additional upgrades to iHEER are planned to make project management of sites, including monitoring of long-term controls, simpler for HEER Office staff.

Honolulu Rail Transit Project

As drivers along H-1 see every day on their morning commutes, the rail project has become a reality. The Honolulu Rail Transit Project (HRTTP) Skyline guideways are springing up across the landscape and pre-construction activities are now occurring within much of the downtown portions of the planned route. The HEER Office maintains close regulatory oversight of the HRTTP to ensure any contamination encountered during construction is managed safely, efficiently and in accordance with state law.

The HRTTP includes construction of 21 rail stations, installation of hundreds of columns to support 20 miles of elevated guideways, extensive utility relocations, a large rail car maintenance and storage facility, and several park and rides.

During FY 2025, guideway construction accelerated in the industrialized areas between the airport and Iwilei, and preconstruction activities associated with utility relocation continued throughout the City Center part of the project. Both the Airport and City Center Guideway Areas are located within densely populated regions of Oahu in areas with much higher potential for contamination than the western segments. DOH is particularly concerned with an

area along Dillingham Boulevard where Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) contractors encountered very high volatile concentrations during geotechnical boring several years ago. The Dillingham section rail alignment has been shifted to the mauka side of Dillingham Boulevard due to the hazards and density of utilities buried under the roadway.

To address environmental concerns in accordance with the Programmatic EHE-EHMP, oversight of the H RTP continues to require close coordination between the HEER Office SDAR Section and multiple other regulatory authorities. During FY 2025, the SDAR Section worked closely with the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB), the Clean Water Branch (CAB), and the HEER Office's EP&R Section on the H RTP.

Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) Issues Throughout the State

UXO continues to be one of the main contaminants of concern throughout the State. Over the past two decades, dozens of UXO investigations have taken place throughout the State at both active military installations and Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS), highlighting the number and severity of the UXO problem. Many of the areas that have been and are currently being investigated are in or near residential areas (e.g., Waimea/Kamuela, Waikoloa Village, Maku'u/Popoki) and/or in areas heavily trafficked by the public (e.g., Maunawili Trail, Hapuna Beach, Bellows Air Force Base, Molokini, 'Ahihi Kina'u, etc.). Since there is no way to ensure 100% clearance of a UXO site, these sites present a potential danger to the public at-large. The HEER Office has continued to work with DoD counterparts to address UXO concerns and inform the public of hazards. The HEER Office has developed an Areawide Environmental Hazard Management Plan which is an explosives safety guide for the Waikoloa Maneuver Area.

This year the HEER Office worked with the Army Corps of Engineers on a Record of Decision which determined no further actions are required for Areas A and G of the Waikoloa Maneuver. Areas A and G consist of three non-continuous areas totaling approximately 6,888 acres of land to the south of Waikoloa and in and around Waikii Ranch. The NFA determination for munitions and munitions constituents was based on data collected during the Remedial Investigation and other lines of evidence.

Brownfields Re-development of Various Properties Across the State and Counties

Land re-use and re-development is critical when living on an island and to facilitate that, the HEER Office has dedicated its time and resources to assist private parties in their endeavors. In addition to these projects, the HEER Office has assisted the City and County of Honolulu in researching potential parcels for use as transitional housing.

The HEER Office has had a longstanding relationship with the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism and continues to assist the Department of Hawaiian Homelands, DOT, the Department of Education, and other State departments in providing guidance and oversight for their projects. The EPA Brownfields grant funding supports efforts to assess and clean-up contaminated and abandoned industrial and commercial properties. In the last year, the HEER Office has worked closely with the City and County of Honolulu to discuss their redevelopment plans for the Iwilei District and with the Office of Hawaiian Affairs regarding their plans for Kakaako Makai, both of which are anticipated to rely on Brownfields funding support. Additionally, on Kauai, the HEER Office is overseeing the assessment of the former Kekaha Sugar Mill using federal Brownfields assistance grant funding.

High Priority State Sites

A key role of the HEER Office is to identify sites where current or projected exposures to hazardous chemicals could pose a threat to public health or the environment. These sites receive high priority designations. Examples of progress on high priority sites are described below:

DOT Airports

Due to historic releases and potential exposure hazards, particularly during construction and redevelopment projects, several airport sites are considered high priority sites. Throughout FY 2025, the HEER Office has been working with the State Department of Transportation Airports Division (DOT-A) as they evaluate their facilities for impacts from historic use of Aqueous Film-Forming Foam (AFFF) fire suppressants that contain PFAS, also known as "Forever Chemicals." The HEER Office has taken the lead on developing screening methods for evaluating PFAS Total Risk impacts to soil and groundwater and has worked closely with DOT-A and their contractors on developing sampling plans, evaluating data, and selecting appropriate remedies.

DOT-A also has many new and ongoing construction projects within areas of their properties contaminated with PFAS and with other contaminants, such as petroleum, heavy metals, and pesticides. The HEER Office has been working closely with DOT-A to ensure planned construction areas are adequately characterized and that appropriate Construction EHMPs are developed to properly manage contamination during construction activities. Additionally, the HEER Office is working with DOT-A to revise their Programmatic EHMP for all state airports to ensure appropriate long-term guidance is in place for future projects which should help to streamline construction activities in the future.

Kapalama Container Yard Development

The Kapalama Container Yard project is a massive re-development project on both land and sea. The area was utilized by multiple and various tenants after it was transferred to the State from the Army in 1983 when it was known as the Kapalama Military Reservation. Historic information regarding the former military reservation indicated petroleum, heavy metal, and polychlorinated biphenyls contamination on-site. An investigation was performed prior to construction and an EHMP was implemented on the site. Given the vast amount of soil and concrete that needs to be moved or disposed of, the HEER Office has worked closely with DOT's contractor Kiewit and the Solid Waste Section to ensure that the material being generated is being handled in accordance with state regulations. Throughout FY 2025, the HEER Office has continued to monitor this project and received regular updates on the management of contaminated soil stockpile from this project.

Kaka'ako Redevelopment Projects

Historic light industrial and commercial activities have resulted in varying degrees of contamination and environmental hazards across many sites in the Kaka'ako District of Honolulu. In addition, the historic use of contaminated backfill in some areas has added to potential environmental hazards in both the Kaka'ako and Iwilei districts. Most contamination in these areas has posed little hazard as it remained beneath existing structures and was undisturbed.

Recent large-scale redevelopment of these properties for mixed-use and multi-family housing has focused the attention of the HEER Office on these sites. Without proper management of the contaminated soil and groundwater at these sites during construction, they could pose a significant

environmental hazard to site workers, the public, and the environment. Property owners including Howard Hughes, Kamehameha Schools, Castle and Cook, and other private developers and owners have been working closely with the HEER Office over the past few years to identify and characterize contamination at these properties and implement appropriate remedies.

Pu'uloa Range Training Area in Ewa Beach, Oahu

Neighborhood concerns about potential lead contamination emanating from the U.S. Marine Corps (USMC) small arms firing range in Ewa Beach brought this site to the attention of the HEER Office a few years ago. As an active firing range, it is not covered under the DSMOA Cooperative Agreement. The HEER Office worked with USMC to develop a sampling plan for the shoreline soil adjacent to the range and in FY 2025 reviewed a preliminary report of the results of that sampling. The HEER Office identified additional investigations that are necessary to complete the characterization of the site and determine if a Response Action is required under HRS 128D. The HEER Office continues to work with USMC, the community, and the state legislature's Working Group to address potential hazards at this site and community concerns.

Del Monte Corporation Oahu Plantation NPL Site and Kunia Village PFAS-Impacted Water Supply

In 1977, the primary well providing drinking water to the Kunia Village in central Oahu was contaminated by a release of the pesticides dibromo-chloropropane (DBCP) and ethylene dibromide (EDB). The well was closed in 1980 and shortly afterward, the site was added to the EPA's National Priorities List (NPL). The EPA and DOH have been working with the responsible party to clean up the pesticide contamination in the drinking water aquifer for several decades now to great success. During most of that time, Kunia Village has been relying on two other wells located closer to Schofield Barracks for their drinking water.

In FY 2023, the DOH Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB) discovered PFAS contamination in those wells at concentrations that exceeded HEER Office action levels. The HEER Office and SDWB began working with Kunia Village and the EPA to address this potential drinking water hazard for the residents of Kunia Village. Also, the HEER Office has been interacting with the Army Garrison to try to identify the source(s) of the PFAS contamination through the DSMOA Cooperative Agreement, since one of the impacted wells belongs to the Army. In the interim, a

temporary alternative water supply was provided by the Army to the Village at the request of the HEER Office and Kunia Village.

In FY 2025, the HEER Office worked with the EPA and SDWB to support Kunia Village's attempts to secure funding for a new drinking water well on their own property. The HEER Office worked with the EPA to address groundwater use restrictions that are part of a Consent Decree placed on the area as part of the remedy to address the NPL site pesticide contamination. EPA is also providing funding through the SDWB for the development of the new

well and installation of an activated charcoal filtration system to treat any water potentially impacted by PFAS or other contaminants. It is anticipated that Kunia Village's drinking water concerns will soon be resolved, but the HEER Office will continue to work with the Army Garrison to identify the source of the PFAS contamination and implement an appropriate remedy.

The HEER Office works to stay up to date on changing environmental hazards and adjusts remedies when data show new risks to human health and the environment are present.

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Sites Eligible for Possible Listing Under CERCLA

Three Hawaii sites are listed on the [EPA National Priority List \(NPL\)](#). Costs for site investigation and cleanup are being borne by the responsible parties. The state is not obligated to contribute to cleanup or future operation and maintenance costs.

The EPA's Superfund Website [SEMS Search](#) lists 247 sites in Hawaii. Twenty-five are on the National Priority List (NPL) as Final NPL (the three listed above), Part of NPL Site (14 sites), Deleted NPL (one site), or removed from NPL (7 sites).

One hundred forty-eight (148) sites are No Further Remedial Action Planned (NFRAP) Sites, which do not qualify for the NPL based on existing available information.

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THE HAWAII STATE RESPONSE PROGRAM (HSRP) CHEMICAL RELEASE NOTIFICATION LOG

The Hawaii State Response Program Release Notification Log shows a listing of all hazardous substances (chemical and petroleum) release notifications received by the HEER Office emergency response team during the fiscal year. The Release Notification Log is sorted in order of Island, Locality, and the Case Name.

The FY2025 Release Notification Log lists 471 chemicals and petroleum release notifications managed by the HEER Office State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs). 283 cases were directly related to the release of petroleum related substances.

HEER Office SOSCs performed direct oversight on 359 cases requiring on-site visits or off-scene coordination. 108 cases were referred to other agencies.

HEER Office SOSCs actively participated in 26 oil and chemical release drills working with various commercial and response organizations.

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The Hawaii Response Program (HSRP) – List of Priority Sites

Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, Section 7, mandates that a State List of Sites be published annually listing the sites with potential or known hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants. In FY2025, the HEER Office had oversight responsibilities for 1,121 active sites and reached No Further Action (NFA) determinations at 12 sites.

We present the list in two sections.

The Hawaii State Response Program List of Priority Sites presents all non-military Hawaii sites identified for potential or known non-emergency response actions under HRS 128D. Current Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) supports only part of the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office response obligation for these sites. 1,121 active sites under direct Department of Health (DOH) oversight in the various State programs are listed. 12 state sites with known or suspected contamination received No Further Action Determinations, with six as a No Further Action with Institutional Controls in place. An additional site was closed with a No Action status in FY2025.

The Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program List of Priority Sites presents military sites in Hawaii for which Site Discovery, Assessment and Remediation (SDAR) Section provides oversight. Hazardous substance response actions are managed by various Department of Defense branches under Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) authorities, with regulatory oversight from SDAR. Cleanup sites within the Pearl Harbor Naval Complex are co-regulated by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), due to the National Priorities List (“Superfund”) designation. The Department of Defense (DoD) sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance (UXO) sites. Investigations and cleanups of military sites with petroleum-contaminated sites are conducted under 128D authorities, as petroleum is not covered under CERCLA. ERRF funds are not currently used for oversight of non-emergency military cleanups in Hawaii. Staff positions providing oversight for this work are currently

funded by federal DSMOA grants. The list includes 546 sites that are co-managed by DOH and DoD under CERCLA and HRS 128D authorities.

Because the Air Force and Navy work systematically to address high priority sites first, the majority of the remaining sites are medium and low priority. In FY2025, one clean up decision (NFA w/ ICs) was reached at a DSMOA site. Some sites will require ongoing management of residual contamination through Environmental Hazard Management Plans. The lists are sorted in the order of Island, Locality or Installation, and Site Name. See iHEER for further information.

The Status of Site Discovery indicates that limited sampling targeting a specific type of hazard is being done or has been done.

A Status of Assessment indicates sites that have sampling planned or underway and the hazard has not yet been determined.

A Status of Remedy Needed, Remedy Selected, Remedy in Place, or NFAIC indicates that a site has been categorized as a potential hazard as sampling data indicate that contaminant concentrations exceed Hawaii Environmental Action Levels and use restrictions need to be imposed to limit access to the contamination (Institutional Controls) that may include physical barriers that limit exposure to the contaminants (Engineering Controls).

A Status of NFA indicates that hazards have been managed by removal or destruction of the contaminants.

Generally, the Hawaii Environmental Action Levels (EALs) are conservative levels set to be protective of long term, daily exposures.

FY2025 Response Program Activity

Response Program Activity Summary data presented in this section for the Hawaii State Response Program (SRP) includes all Hawaii sites identified for non-emergency response actions during FY2025 and sites requiring evaluation if an assessment or response action is required under HEER Office authority. The HEER Office manages sites within several program areas depending upon eligibility, funding, and level of responsible party participation as:

- State Sites (General Funded)
- SRP (State Response Program) (Federally funded)
- Hawaii Brownfields Revitalization Sites (Brownfields)
- Hawaii Voluntary Response Program (VRP) Sites (Federally funded)
- Site Discovery (SDAR) and Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection (PA/SI) Sites (Federally funded)
- Fast Track
- EPA or National Priority List (NPL)
- TSCA (Toxic Substances Control Act PCB cleanup)

DSMOA Department of Defense Sites

Over time, a site may be managed within the HEER Office under one or more program areas, starting with the site assessment phase and if required by the State, through to cleanup completion. Counts are sites that are open.
