

# Injury Prevention Milestones in Hawaii 2009-2019

## Program

The IPCS wins a 3-year, \$1.5 million grant (\$500,000 each year) from the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to continue efforts to prevent suicide and suicide attempts among youth. The IPCS receives the national Prevention Program Achievement Award from the Safe States Alliance.

The CDC selects Hawai'i as one of three States to implement a coordinated messaging strategy to address injury and violence prevention.

The IPCS receives a Core Violence and Injury Prevention grant to help ensure progress in injury prevention and surveillance efforts in Hawai'i.

The statewide system of gatekeeper trainings for suicide prevention is enhanced with the development of Task Forces on all major islands.

With assistance from IPCS, the Executive Office on Aging (EOA) convened a Blue Ribbon Fall Prevention Task Force that coordinates statewide efforts to reduce falls among older adults.

The IPCS receives a Core State Violence and Injury Prevention (Core SVIPP) grant to help ensure progress in injury prevention and surveillance efforts.

The IPCS also receives a Prescription Drug Overdose: Data-Driven Prevention Initiative (DDPI) grant to support efforts to advance and evaluate actions to address opioid misuse, abuse, and overdose.

Drowning and Aquatic Injury Prevention Advisory Committee established.

Suicide Prevention Strategic Plan endorsed by Legislature. Goal set to reduce suicides by 25% by 2025 through HCR66.

The EMIPSB, in collaboration with the Hawai'i Drowning and Aquatic Injury Prevention Advisory Committee, launched a new <https://hioceansafety.com/> to encourage residents and visitors to swim at beaches with lifeguards to prevent drownings or serious injury in the ocean.

Hawaii Concussion Awareness Management Program (HCAMP), in partnership with Core SVIPP, expanded sports concussion education training for students, parents and coaches.

Act 54 - Complete Streets is passed that establishes a taskforce to develop guidelines for county policies accommodating all road users.

Bill 25 - A Complete Streets Ordinance for Oahu is passed, which laid the groundwork for roadway improvements for bicycle and pedestrian safety.

Act 73- All passenger seat belt bill is passed, which closes the gap in Hawai'i's seat belt laws.

Good Samaritan Law. Provides drug overdose immunity.

Governor launched Opioid Initiative that lead to state opioid plan and 6 work groups in place to implement plan.

Act 47 requires drivers to allow at least three feet of separation between the driver's vehicle and the bicycle when passing or overtaking the bicyclist.

Act 180, HB330 appropriates \$150,000 to the Department of Health to support youth suicide early intervention, prevention, and education initiatives in all counties focusing on youth between the ages of 10 through 24 for 2019 – 2020 fiscal year.

ACT 183, HB1272 Authorizes pharmacies to accept the return of any prescription drug for disposal via collection receptacles or mail-back programs.

Act 150, SB1466 SD2 HD2 establishes a process by which a law enforcement, family or household member, medical professional, educator, or colleague may obtain a court order to prevent a person from accessing firearms and ammunition when the person poses a danger of causing bodily injury to oneself or another.
