As the category of storm increases, more Kaua'i families plan to evacuate to a public shelter.

WILDFIRE PREVENTION MEASURES



Three out of five households have taken measures to protect their home from wildfires, such as:



cleaning gutters



clearing brush



plants \geq 5 ft away from house

EVACUATION ROUTES

Two out of five households have only one way to evacuate their neighborhood by car.



Have an emergency kit packed, and become familiar with the evacuation routes to leave your neighborhood.
