Aloha,

According to our records, you have attested that you or your primary caregiver resides at, owns, or controls the active or intended cannabis grow site at "Care Waialua," TMK #1-6-8-006-010-0000-000, Waialua, HI 96791. The Department of Health, Office of Medical Cannabis Control and Regulation (OMCCR) is aware of a law enforcement action at Care Waialua on October 24, 2024. In response, for 30 days from the date of this letter, OMCCR will waive the fee normally assessed to change your designated grow site from Care Waialua to an approved location.

We are unable to waive fees for electronic submissions through our website at this time.

This letter is also notification that if the requirements for a registered patient to grow cannabis are not followed, a patient's 329 card may be revoked.

The requirements for a registered patient to grow cannabis for medical use include:

- Only the registered patient or their designated caregiver (**named on the patient's 329 registration card**) are allowed to handle (**care for, touch, water, harvest, etc.**) that patient's medical cannabis plants, harvested cannabis flower, or manufactured cannabis products.
- Cannabis for medical use may be grown by a registered patient or their designated caregiver only at **one** of the following locations:
  - The residence of the registered patient;
  - The residence of the patient's designated caregiver; or
  - Another site that is either owned or controlled by the registered patient or their designated caregiver.
- The actual physical location of a registered patient's medical cannabis plants must match the grow site address stated on the patient's 329 card.
- Each medical cannabis plant must be tagged with the registered patient's valid registration number and expiration date and the tag must be affixed to the plant.

Failure to adhere to these requirements is a violation of chapter 11-160, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), which may result in administrative action, including the revocation of your 329 card for at least 180 days.

Be advised that the Department of Health may contact you or your primary caregiver (if applicable), in person or by phone or email, for access to verify the accuracy of your grow site information. This includes inspections of grow sites used by patients or their designated caregiver to verify plant count limits and compliance with the above requirements.

If OMCCR is unable to verify the accuracy of the information included in your registration due to a failure by you or your primary caregiver (if applicable) to provide us with relevant access or information, we may revoke your registration and you will no longer be afforded protection under part IX, chapter 329, HRS, chapter 11-160, HAR, and all other applicable laws for the medical use of cannabis in the State of Hawaii. Furthermore, should we have reason to believe a violation of any provision of part IX of chapter 329, HRS, or 11-160, HAR, has occurred, we may investigate and notify the proper state or local authorities.
