Guidance for Patients and Caregivers:

Caregiver Updates

Overview

As of January 1, 2025, primary caregivers were no longer authorized to cultivate cannabis for their registered patients. Recently legislation, Act 46, Session Laws Hawaii (SLH) 2025 has removed this sunset provision, restoring caregivers' ability to cultivate medical cannabis for their registered patient(s). Additionally, the change now allows a primary caregiver to be registered to care for up to five qualifying patients at a time, an increase from the previous limit of one patient.

Primary Caregiver Registration Requirements

- All primary caregivers must register with the Department of Health.
- Each primary caregiver may be registered with no more than five qualifying patients at any given time.
- A minor patient may register **up to two primary caregivers**, provided both caregivers are the parent, guardian, or legal custodian of that minor.

Authorized Sources of Medical Cannabis

- Qualifying patients may obtain medical cannabis or manufactured cannabis products only through the following means:
 - From a licensed dispensary pursuant to <u>Hawaii Revised Statues (HRS)</u>, 329D
 - By growing cannabis personally, within limits set to provide an adequate supply per section <u>HRS 329-122.</u>
 - From a registered primary caregiver who grows cannabis on behalf of their qualifying patient(s).

Limitations on Grow Site Locations

• No single location shall be permitted to have **more than five grow sites** registered to it.
