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SPIN CONFERENCE OFFERS VALUABLE SUPPORT FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

HONOLULU - The Special Parent Information Network (SPIN) announces the 26th Annual SPIN Conference, titled "SPIN the Case for Evidence-Based," to be held on Saturday, April 21, 2012 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the University of Hawaii at Manoa Campus Center.

Since 1986, SPIN has been organizing conferences to give families of children with disabilities an opportunity to gain valuable information and meet and network with other parents and professionals. It's a time to get reenergized for the sometimes challenging job of parenting and advocating for our children with special needs.

The conference showcases 16 workshops on topics including: universal design for learning, positive behavioral supports, the Individualized Education Program (IEP), transition, autism, sensory integration, social skills, positive behavioral supports and much more. State Department of Education Superintendent Kathryn Matayoshi, will give the opening remarks. In addition, there will be table displays showcasing agencies and programs that provide support to children and youth with disabilities and their families.

The registration fee is \$25 per parent (or \$35 for two family members attending together), or \$35 per professional. Registration forms are available at www.spinhawaii.org.
