



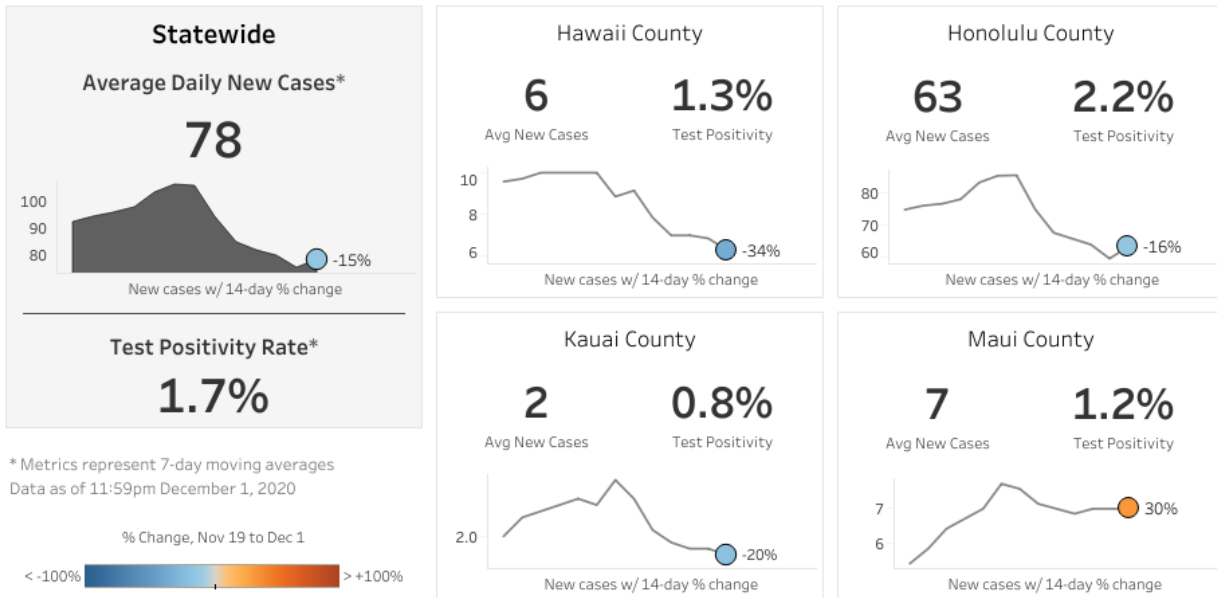

Two Additional Deaths and 144 New Cases Reported Today

COVID-19 has claimed the lives of two more O'ahu residents. A woman, 80-years-old or older, had been hospitalized with underlying conditions. A man, in the 70-79-year-old age group, had also been in the hospital and had underlying conditions.

This report includes cases up until Tuesday at 11:59 p.m. Full data is posted on the State COVID-19 dashboard and on the DOH Disease Outbreak & Control website at noon each day. HawaiiCOVID19.com/dashboard

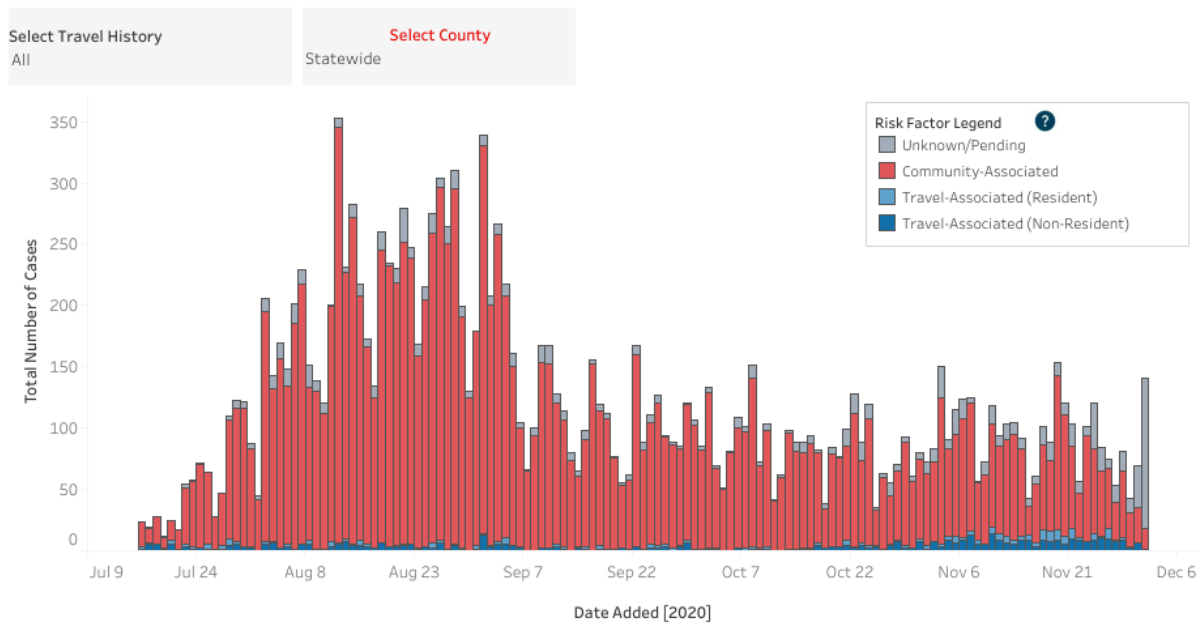

Safe Travels Digital Platform Updated

The Safe Travels Digital platform’s help page has undergone a major update that includes new information to assist travelers navigate their way around the web form. Highlights of the updates to the website <https://ets.hawaii.gov/travelhelp/> include:

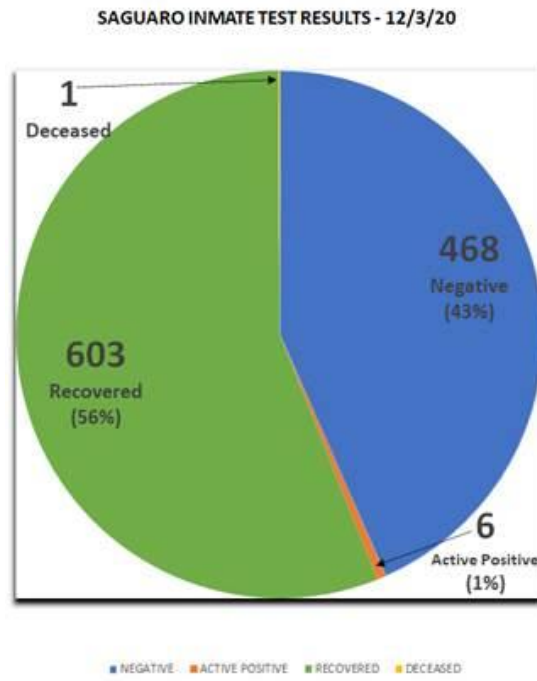
- How to download a quality PDF of a test result from a trusted testing partner
- Examples of accepted test forms from trusted testing and travel partners
- Other important information.

It is critical that travelers obtain the correct test form from a trusted testing partner and upload it into the Safe Travels Digital platform, in the correct format, to avoid being rejected by the system.

Travelers are required to have their negative test results uploaded and validated by the Safe Travels platform before they depart to Hawai'i or have a hard paper copy of a negative test result in hand when they arrive. Failure to do so, will result in a 14-day quarantine.

Mass Inmate Testing Continues

Surge testing of Hawai'i inmates at the Saguaro Correctional Center in Eloy, AZ continues. Of the 123 active positive cases, 117 have been medically cleared and considered recovered. The next round of surge testing results is pending. Retesting of all negative cases will continue until there are no positives. The current test results of the Hawai'i inmate population at Saguaro are broken down as follows:



Negative inmates will remain in a precautionary quarantine while they undergo repeat surge testing. There are currently 1,079 inmates housed at Saguaro. PSD has established an information hotline with recorded updates on the Saguaro testing at: 808-587-1421.

Surge testing at Waiawa Correctional Facility (WCF) is also ongoing. Of the three (3) inmate results received today, two (2) were negative and one (1) was inconclusive. The active positive inmate cases remain unchanged at 134. All 26 staff results received were negative and nine (9) of eleven (11) staff who reported positive cases have been cleared to return to work. DOH is continuing its contact tracing. 8,228 Passengers Arrive on Wednesday


Yesterday, a total of 8,228 people arrived in Hawai'i from out of state. A total of 3,690 people indicated they came to Hawai'i for vacation. There were also 1,674 returning residents. The trans-pacific passenger arrival data is derived from data provided by the Safe Travels digital system.

Helpful Resources



The infographic is titled "SAFE TRAVELS HAWAII QUICK FACTS" and is divided into three main sections: Domestic Trans-Pacific Travel, Traveling Inter-County (between counties), and International Trans-Pacific Travel. Each section lists requirements for a 14-day quarantine and provides ways to bypass it. Domestic travel requires a NAAT test within 72 hours of departure. Inter-county travel has options for pre-test or post-arrival testing. International travel from Japan has specific requirements. A table at the bottom details second tests for non-quarantine travelers in Honolulu, Hawaii County, Maui County, and Kauai County. Domestic Trans-Pacific Travel

14-Day Quarantine

To Bypass Quarantine:

- Proof of negative test result must be uploaded or brought in hand in hard copy prior to departure or remain in quarantine for 14 days
- Must take a nucleic acid amplification (NAAT) pre-travel test within 72 hours from the final leg of departure. The State of Hawai'i will accept test results ONLY from TRUSTED TESTING AND TRAVEL PARTNERS.
- Applies to all passengers ages 5 and over; travelers pay for test
- Must complete Safe Travels Hawai'i online form prior to arrival
- Or other exemption provided by the state
- TEMPORARY: On Kaua'i, as of Dec. 2, 2020, all travelers must quarantine 14-days upon arrival with or without a test.

Traveling Inter-County (between counties)

14-Day Quarantine

To Bypass Quarantine:

- **Traveling into City and County of Honolulu**
No test and no quarantine required
- **Traveling into County of Hawai'i**
OPTION 1: Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic trans-Pacific; OR
OPTION 2: Post-arrival test in quarantine until negative test received and verified. May break quarantine to test.
- **Traveling into Maui County**
Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic trans-Pacific
- **Traveling into Kaua'i County**
TEMPORARY: as of Dec. 2, 2020, all travelers must quarantine 14-days upon arrival with or without a test.
- Or other exemption provided by the state or county

International Trans-Pacific Travel

14-Day Quarantine

To Bypass Quarantine:

- **Travelers from Japan**
Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic trans-Pacific
- Currently no other pre-travel test exemptions
