For Year 4 of its contract with DOH, PHNS will have targeted all remaining students to take the online health curriculum. In Year 5, PHNS will be implementing "Return to Learn" for educators to recognize symptoms and help students in the classroom with possible head injury.

#### V. Old Business

## A. Project Head, Neck, Spine (PHNS) Update:

According to Allison Tsuchida of HCAMP, three schools are currently utilizing the online health curriculum; one high school on Maui and two middle schools on Oahu. There are presently 11-sites and a total of 187-students and three-instructors who've participated thus far. A pre- and post-test was newly implemented to the curriculum.

In progress: HCAMP staff submitted the upper elementary content to the UH IRB (Institutional Review Board) and to the DOE research committee for review. They are currently searching for 5<sup>th</sup>-grade teachers who can help to validate the curriculum. PHNS is aiming to release the complete version by April 2019.

# B. <u>Pacific Disabilities Center (PDC)-Hawaii Neurotrauma Registry (HNTR)</u> <u>Update:</u>

(Highlighted points from HNTR Summary Report)

DOH is preparing a modification for funding for Year 7, March 20, 2019 – March 19, 2020.

Currently, 55-individuals have registered with HNTR between March 20, 2018 – January 18, 2019, increasing the number of total individuals to 306 year-to-date. In addition, HNTR received six-referrals from Queen's Medical Center in November 2018 and one-referral in December. HNTR staffs are

currently seeking a contact at Kapiolani Medical Center to propose a referral system.

For Brain Injury Awareness Month, tentative events include the "Brain Train Family Fun Fair" and another at Leeward Community College. Booth will include activity stations, informational tables, demonstrations on how to fall safely, and more.

## D. DOH Update:

One of the objectives in the Neurotrauma Supports strategic plan calls for provider education and awareness. During the last board meeting, DOH staff Chelsea Ko requested that board members provide suggestions on how to accomplish these goals: 1) what the greatest needs of survivors are and 2) how to measure if intervention made a difference. Some of the suggestions include collaborating with people/organizations with direct contact to brain injury survivors:

- Police Academy
- Urgent care facilities for known patients with brain injury
- Discharged social workers
- Retired NFL players; possible connection to brain injury relatedprograms
- Martial Arts and gyms
