

RAPID Hawaii: A Statewide Collaboration on Acute Stroke Care Current Update: May 18, 2021

Wahiawa General Hospital:

Currently live with RAPIDai and Queen's is receiving images.

Castle Medical Center:

Currently live with RAPIDai and Queen's is receiving images. Queen's is also beginning telestroke coverage of Castle Medical Center beginning in June 19.

Kaukini Medical Center:

Awaiting RAPID server installation, which was delayed due to upgrades occurring on the hospital imaging system (PACS) which are needed so the local radiologist, neurologists, and other physicians can review the RAPID images on their local system. We met with the Chief Medical Officer and Radiology Director to expedite implementation. No updates on this site yet.

Kauai Veterans Memorial Hospital:

Currently live with RAPIDai. IschemaView is currently working with the site on training prior to full go-live. Queen's also began telestroke coverage of KVMH with first patient seen on June 16.

Hilo Medical Center:

Currently live with RAPIDai and Queen's is receiving images.

Kona Community Hospital:

Currently live with RAPIDai. IschemaView is currently working with the site on training prior to full go-live.

School Based Stroke Education Program AHA Sponsorship:

We were able to conduct the school-based FAST education program at three schools on Oahu in May: Holy Family Catholic Academy, Nanaikapono Elementary School, and St. Ann School.
