- I. Call to Order Meeting was called to order at 1:35 pm by Chair William Rodrigues. Quorum present.
- II. Approval of Minutes from the January 11, 2022 meeting Board Member Karen Klemme motioned to accept the minutes as written. Board Member Rita Manriquez seconded the motion. All Board Members present voted in favor of minutes being accepted as written. No questions or discussions.
- III. **Review of Agenda** Agenda accepted as written. No questions or discussions.
- IV. New Business:
 - A. Iowa Public Health, CWS, and BIA Collaboration

"Family First" virtual presentation by James Pender, Iowa Dept. of Public Health; Janee Harvey, Iowa Dept. of Human Services; and June Klein-Bacon, Brain Injury Alliance of Iowa. Presentation focused on families involved with child welfare services and considers whether a history of head injury is causing a barrier to success. Topics covered: research on intersection of brain injury and child welfare; implementation and impact of Family First Act; implementation of pilot Resource Facilitation within child welfare services; framework for embedding Resource Facilitation in child welfare programs.

V. **Old Business:**

A. Project Head, Neck, Spine (HNS) update:

(*Dr. Allison Tsuchida reporting*) Nearly 100 new students started the curriculum since last meeting update. To date, approximately 1900 students have joined. HNS reached out to the home school association prior to the start of the new semester. Enrolled 2 more at-home schooled students.

Evaluative data for middle and high school featured a range (%) column to show high and low scores. Module 2 average score is above 80%. Pre/post test scores increased about 12.7%, showing a significant increase in knowledge. No new data for upper and lower elementary. Professional development course with DOE have started on February 1st. To date, 8 schools have joined. Numbers are projected to increase as teachers go through the educator course. Currently, Oahu, Maui, Kauai, and Hawaii islands are represented with teachers in the elementary and secondary school level. 18 educators have started the course and 12 have completed. Data showed all modules are reaching the 80% benchmark. Summary score for all students who completed the curriculum are above 90%.

B. Brain Injury Association of Hawaii (BIA-H) update:

(Dorothy Aliilua reporting) BIAH welcomed new board member last month, Michele Tong. BIAH is moving well into the position. Will have more updates to share before the year ends. A few more board members are expected to join soon.

- C. Kapiolani Medical Center for Women and Children Update: (*Lisa Dau reporting*) April announcements:
 - April is National Child Abuse Awareness month. Encouraged all to wear blue on April 1st to bring awareness to this issue.
