Hawaii Pacific Health (HPH) - Matt Wells

New certification regulations require Matt dedicate 100% of his position to trauma.

Although positioned to be the 2024 Chairperson for Hawaii Stroke Coalition

(HSC), Matt will now be participating in HSC as a private citizen. Outreach activities include the upcoming Senior Health Fair at Pearlridge and recording of a "Health Matters" radio spot with Dr. Matt Koenig of QMC. In support of other trauma related organizations, HPH hosted KIPC and QMC to train 40 new car seat technicians.

Catholic Charities Hawaii (CCH) – <u>Stella Wong</u>

CCH successfully completed accreditation site visits for their 40+ programs. To help Hawaii families find/remain housed CCH is once again taking applications for rent relief. Those impacted by the Maui wildfires and COVID 19 pandemic are encouraged to apply. E. DOH Update - Neurotrauma Program (NTP) – *Michele Tong*Along with partners QMC and KMCWC, participated in Hawaii Children and Youth Day, educating on head injury. With community partners further head injury education was shared at Waianae YMCA bike rodeo and Aliamanu National Night Out. In support of the HSC and DOH "BEFAST" stroke campaign, NTP will distribute posters and magnets statewide to all DDD offices. On 10/25/23 NTP hosted the webinar "Family Preservation through Policy, Training and Identification". From the 91 people registered, 57 attended. All registrants received a link to view the webinar at their convenience. In collaboration with DHS Family First Hawaii, on 11/9/23, NTP will be hosting the webinar "The Impact of Brain Injury in Parenting and Child Welfare" which builds on the work covered in the 10/25/23 webinar.
