The storage shall be in a staff controlled work cabinet-counter apart from either resident's bathrooms or bedrooms.</p> <p><b>FINDINGS</b> Resident #1 – "Triamcinolone Acetonide 0.1%" was not properly labeled (no label).</p>	<p>To comply with rule 11-100.1-15 I called doctor #1 to prescribe resident #1 the Triamcinolone Acetonide 0.1% w/ proper label to prevent from recurring this problem again resident #1 who self-medicate herself (authorized by physician) I will give her the tube, I keep the box and after she medicate herself w/ supervision I take back the tube put it back in the box and lock it in medicine cabinet.
