## Plan of Correction

When I brought my client for a doctor's visit on 10-26-15, I had asked the doctor to update only two medications my client is currently taking, Benadryl and Haldol. The doctor discontinued the Haldol as shown on the attached Physicians Record. However, I was not aware that the doctor also ordered a Cogentin which the patient hasn't taken at anytime since she is under my care. I was not aware of that order and no prescription for Cogentin was given to me before we left the office, so such medicine was not reflected in the medication record that was purchased.

On April 19, 2016 after my annual injection, I went back to the doctor's office to clarify such order since patient has never taken Cogentin. He made a note that "It was a mistake," he should have ordered Benadryl instead of Cogentin. See attached.

In the future whenever I bring my clients for a doctor's visit, I should check all doctor's notes on the Physicians Record and clarify anything that's not clear before leaving.
