Residents <u>will not eat lunch</u> at home 2/13/19 because of an “excursion”. Primary care giver reports three (3) residents left the house at 7:45 am for a “ride” and will return until 5:30 pm. When asked how often excursions occur, primary care giver replied, “twice a week”. No record for meal substitutions during excursions.</p>	<p>PART 1</p> <p>Correcting the deficiency after-the-fact is not practical/appropriate. For this deficiency, only a future plan is required.</p>

Documentation shall be completed immediately when any incident occurs;</p> <p><u>FINDINGS</u> Resident #1, no evidence in <u>monthly</u> progress notes of observations of the resident's responses. Monthly progress note (2/1/19) reads, "<u>December 2018/ January 2019</u>".</p>	<p>PART 1</p> <p>Correcting the deficiency after-the-fact is not practical/appropriate. For this deficiency, only a future plan is required.</p>

(g) All information contained in the resident's record shall be confidential. Written consent of the resident, or resident's guardian or surrogate, shall be required for the release of information to persons not otherwise authorized to receive it. Records shall be secured against loss, destruction, defacement, tampering, or use by unauthorized persons. There shall be written policies governing access to, duplication of, and release of any information from the resident's record. Records shall be readily accessible and available to authorized department personnel for the purpose of determining compliance with the provisions of this chapter.</p> <p><u>FINDINGS</u> Tampering with medication administration record (MAR). Licensee confirms vacation leave (11/20/18 - 11/29/18). However, licensee initials noted in the MAR indicating licensee made medication available from 11/20-11/29/18.</p>	<p>PART 1</p> <p>Correcting the deficiency after-the-fact is not practical/appropriate. For this deficiency, only a future plan is required.</p>

These receptacles shall be kept closed by tight fitting covers;</p> <p><u>FINDINGS</u> Kitchen, no tight fitting lid for rubbish.
