(a) The Type I ARCH shall provide each resident with an appetizing, nourishing, well-balanced diet that meets the daily nutritional needs and diet order prescribed by state and national dietary guidelines. To promote a social environment, residents, primary care givers and the primary care giver's family members residing in the Type I ARCH shall be encouraged to sit together at meal times. The same quality of foods provided to the primary care givers and their family members shall be made available to the residents unless contraindicated by the resident's physician or APRN, resident's preference or resident's family.FINDINGS Resident #1 – No documented evidence that meals are nutritionally balanced and meets the need of the residents due to menus not being followed. Breakfast menu states cereal, papaya, corned beef, coffee/water. Resident stated it was cereal with milk and one banana. No menu substitution documented. The storage shall be in a staff controlled work cabinet-counter apart from either resident's bathrooms or bedrooms. <u>FINDINGS</u> Pain Relieving Cream and Destin Cream found in resident's drawer in bedroom #1. An open bottle of 70% alcohol found in residents' bathroom #1. Primary Caregiver (PCG) removed them and secured during inspection. Documentation shall be completed immediately when any incident occurs; <u>FINDINCS</u> Resident #1 – Physician changed Polyethylene Glycol 3350 Powder from daily to PRN on 3/29/2022.
