The case manager shall:  Develop an interim care plan for the expanded ARCH resident within forty eight hours of admission to the expanded ARCH and a care plan within seven days of admission. The care plan shall be based on a comprehensive assessment of the expanded ARCH resident's needs and shall address the medical, nursing, social, mental, behavioral, recreational, dental, emergency care, nutritional, spiritual, rehabilitative needs of the resident and any other specific need of the resident. This plan shall identify all services to be provided to the expanded ARCH resident and shall include, but not be limited to, treatment and medication orders of the expanded ARCH resident's physician or APRN, measurable goals and outcomes for the expanded ARCH resident; specific procedures for intervention or services required to meet the expanded ARCH resident's needs; and the names of persons required to perform interventions or services required by the expanded ARCH resident;  FINDINGS  Resident #1 — "At risk for falls," care plan states, "Resident will be up and about in her room, to the toilet and walk to the living room/dining room area with assist."
