FINDINGS  Resident #1 – Physician ordered on 8/30/23 for Mupirocin 2% ointment "Apply to left lower leg twice a day PRN"; however, the medication label reads, "Apply one application topically to affected area twice a day". The medication was documented as given every other day from the October 2023 to September 2024 medication administration record (MAR).
