Planner IV position opening Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) Planner

The primary purpose of this position is to plan, develop, and improve the state's plan for the Strategic National Stockpile, a program in partnership with the HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response, designed to distribute pharmaceuticals and antidotes to the public in the event of a natural disaster, bioterror attack, or pandemic.

Salary \$4,413 - \$5,373 per month, depending on training and experience (SR-22, Steps C to H)

Minimum Qualifications

To qualify, you must meet all of the following requirements:

Education: Bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year college or university.

Experience: At least 2.5 years of progressively responsible professional planning experience which included the collection and evaluation of an extensive variety of physical, social, economic and environmental data, determination of public opinion and general community objectives and policies to obtain a comprehensive prospective of conditions and identify problems and opportunities in the area(s) of concern. [NOTE: Advanced degrees in relevant fields (e.g., urban planning, public health, civil engineering, etc.) may fulfill part or all of the experience requirement. Who May Apply

Legal authorization to work requirement: The State of Hawaii requires that all persons seeking employment with the government of the State shall be citizens, nationals, or permanent resident aliens of the United States, or eligible under federal law for unrestricted employment in the U.S.
