To find us at our new location, take Exit 10 off the H-1 freeway in Pearl City. If you're coming from the west, turn left onto Moanalua Road, and if you're coming

from the east, turn right onto Moanalua Road. Proceed west on Moanalua Road, then turn right onto Waimano Home Road, drive up the mountain past Pearl City High School and the Pearl City Cultural Center, and stop at the guard shack. Just let the guard know where you are headed. We are located in the first building on the right, above the guard shack. Guest parking will be in the front lot shown in the photo at left.

We expect to be at our new location by August 1st. However, it would be best to call or email us for the latest update if you're coming to visit us at our office. There may be a short period of time that we will be unavailable as we pack and unpack, but all of our systems (e.g., SDWIS Viewer, SCRS, SATS, etc.) will remain online throughout the move. Only the SDWB and Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office will be moving in August. The remaining DOH environmental offices/branches anticipate moving to their new offices further up the hill by the end of the year or early 2018.
