DWS prepared a Final Environmental Assessment (FEA) Determination of a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) on August 27, 2021.

A public comment period was held from June 8, 2021 to July 9, 2021. Five (5) comments were received and addressed.

Based on the information and recommendation provided by the County, DOH concurs with the County's recommendation and approves the FEA/FONSI for the Lalamilo 10MG Reservoir.
