Dear Mr. Kowalski:

The State Health Planning and Development Agency has evaluated Franciscan Care Services' Certificate of Need application #13-09A for the acquisition of 52 SNF beds, located at 2226 Liliha Street, Honolulu, Hawaii, from St. Francis Healthcare System and St. Francis Medical Center, at a capital cost of \$4,706,352.

Pursuant to Title 11, Chapter 186 of the Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the Agency has determined that:

- (a) The proposal is eligible for administrative review as it meets one or more of the criteria in Subsection 11-186-99.1(b), HAR.
- (b) The applicant, Franciscan Care Services, has proven by a preponderance of the evidence that its proposal meets the Certificate of Need criteria in HAR 11-186-15.
- (c) There is no compelling public interest which will be served by requiring the application to go through the standard review process.


As required under Section 323D-43(b), Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS), the Agency finds that:

1. There is a public need for this proposal.
2. The cost of this proposal will not be unreasonable in light of the benefits it will provide and its impact on health care costs.

Accordingly, the State Health Planning and Development Agency hereby APPROVES and ISSUES a Certificate of Need to Franciscan Care Services for the proposal described in Certificate of Need application #13-09A. The maximum capital expenditure allowed under this approval is \$4,706,352.
